ADDENDUM – Other Requests

<u>Seed Capital - #Recap on the Seed Fund Recapitalization Effort</u> (David Bradbury) – Ultimately, we found a way for VCET to "grant" the funds into eligible companies and then get a "stock warrant" as the "transaction fee" which would have gone into the Seed Fund for long term appreciation if something paid back. I am trying to maintain a list of high potential companies around VT should there be unspent CRF funding in the weeks ahead. We could make a basket of investments (as grants) into 10-20 in short order if needed too.

<u>Foster Parents</u> (Rep. Theresa Wood) - The amount being requested by the Vermont Foster and Adoptive Family Association (VFAFA) is very modest — \$10,000. The mental health of these foster parents is critical to the stability of the children in custody and families. It's a very modest amount but could go a long way. The foster families have had to deal with extra stress during the pandemic.

<u>Nonprofits</u> (Annie Guion, Windham County Human Society) - Please consider granting funds to every non-profit in good standing in the state. State and Federal support has supported us this year, but 2021 looks daunting. We fill the gaps in our communities in very important ways and our services are more important than ever as people lose their homes and their livelihoods.

<u>Reach-up</u> (John Sayles, for the Vermont Reach Up and Food Security Coalitions). We propose that any Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) dollars unspent by December 20 be reallocated as one-time cash assistance to the families with children on Reach Up. [FULL letter can be found HERE]

• This reallocation would be quick and logistically easy, and could be accomplished in a matter of

days by issuing paper checks to each Reach Up household.

- It would directly benefit Vermont children in deep poverty, who have been impacted by the economic and social impacts of the pandemic.
- It would support a group that has not yet seen direct assistance.

Capacity Building

Unemployment Insurance; building reserves; and continuance of \$100 additional funding

<u>Career Placement Training</u> (Alexander Horner) - I am proposing that we use a portion of the funds currently up for reallocation to provide 100 Vermont adults impacted by COVID-19 with tuition assistance to attend courses at Burlington Code Academy and give them the opportunity to start a new career in technology.

Grants into COVID Impacted Tech and Growth Firms (\$5 million) – (David Bradbury) One last effort to request your consideration for CRF grant funding from the to be reallocated sources to be directed into Technology and High Growth startup firms impacted by COVID that are all across Vermont. These companies range from software, tech training, housing units, forest management technology, weather tech, IoT and on and on. Additionally, there are several BIPOC and female founded companies who would be grant funded as well from what we know today. My understanding is that this process has begun.

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<u>Correctional Officers Hazard Pay</u> (former Sen. Vincent Illuzzi for the VSEA) - The Legislature did not appropriate hazard pay funds for state employees in essential jobs on the premise that the Scott Administration and VSEA could come to some agreement. As of today, still no hazard pay for correctional officers. This includes correctional officers who have, are and will work with COVID positive inmates.

<u>Business Grants</u> (Lynn Green, for the VT Lodging Coalition) - We respectfully ask that you support allocating all unexpended Coronavirus Relief Fund dollars to the Agency of Commerce and Community Development and the Tax Department so they can use these additional funds for grants to businesses with unmet needs. The latest formula for determining "unmet needs" factored losses through September 30. That "unmet need" increases exponentially when factoring October numbers due to Vermont lodging's strong reliance on foliage season which was severely impacted by travel guidelines this year. Furthermore, the \$300k cap leaves larger properties with severe and crippling deficits as we enter a very dark winter.
