RE: 2021 Act 9 Sec. 2(c) Report for July JFC Meeting

In accordance with 2021 Act 9 Sec. 2(c), Finance and Management submits:

- A revision to the 2021 Act 9 Sec. 2(c) report which details final CRF carryforward need, final reversions and reallocations completed in June via 2020 Act 154 B.1108 authority;
- Final reversions and appropriations completed in June via 2021 Act 9 Sec. 2b authority; and
- Additional potential CRF reversions tied to pending FEMA claims

In addition, Finance and Management submits a CRF status report, comprised of a timeline of activity since May in both summary and detail formats.

The CRF reallocations to Public Safety and Corrections for CRF-eligible payroll in Exhibit B will yield \$26.75 million General Fund and \$5.6 million Transportation Fund. These amounts may be proposed for reversion in the FY2022 BAA to address a one-time pressure related to Medicaid caseload needs.

\$59.8M CRF spending authority is created for FY2022, of which \$15M is a direct FY2022 appropriation from Act 74 and the remaining \$44.8M is carried forward from FY2021.
