The State of Vermont received \$18.3 million in ARPA Discretionary funds from the Child Care Development Fund. All funds must be obligated by September 30, 2023 and spent by September 30, 2024.

The state has implemented all projects or programs approved for funding from this source. To date, we have spent or reimbursed approximately \$6.2M of the \$18.3M on the purposes already approved related to the child care workforce, child care capacity-building, supports for inclusion and quality, and program administration; see table on next page. Spending has been slower than planned largely due to external factors such as federal student loan payment pause, difficulty in hiring, delays in acquiring supplies, and increased availability of financial aid for higher education. We estimate the state can liquidate approximately \$14.6M via grant agreements and programs already implemented or in motion. CDD proposes applying the remaining ~\$3.8M funds to projects allowed by CCDF that support the successful implementation of Act 76 and/or align with the initial purposes already approved.

The Department of Children and Families requests flexibility to spend down all remaining CCDF ARPA Discretionary funds for any allowed purposes within CCDF to ensure that these federal funds are fully liquidated.

Top priority will be to support the completion of the CDD Information System (CDDIS) Module 1 and maximize state funding available for CDDIS Module 2. This will likely be between \$1.2M and \$2M based on the timing of expenses.

Second priority will be Readiness for Act 76 changes; this would likely be \$2M to \$3M. CDD will provide additional funding and resources to child care programs and/or staff at child care programs to support program quality, inclusion practices, and workforce development in preparation for growth anticipated in Act 76. CDD has identified the following projects that are administratively feasible and high priority are:

- ~\$800K for additional support and training for inclusion and family supports (i.e., increased Strengthening Families grants)
- ~\$1.2M for materials supporting program quality and achievement at higher levels in new STARS quality recognition and improvement system
- ~\$500K for resources and supports for early childhood education students seeking credentials and degrees via institutions of higher education serving Vermont students.

If we still anticipate being unable to spend all funds by September 30, 2024, CDD would award additional Act 76 Readiness Payments to child care programs before the liquidation period ends.
