Medicaid	- Received Oct-Dec quarterly award \$420M	\$108M Program \$32M Admin	No anticipated impacts currently
WIC	\$690k carryforward from FFY25 award (Food+Admin) \$607k received for FFY26 (Food) and \$218k (Admin)	\$500k Food \$400k Admin	Spending should be covered through early-Dec

AHS Federal Funds – Unknown Impacts

Federal Grant Program	Status of FFY26	Average monthly spend	Highlights
TANF	No FFY26 award	\$3.9M	- Award typically received in mid-late October - MOE could be claimed more upfront
Voc Rehab	\$1.9M carryforward from FFY25 award - No FFY26 award	\$1.5M	- Award typically received in mid-late October - MOE could be claimed more upfront
LIHEAP	\$2.4M carryforward from FFY25 award - No FFY26 award	\$13-15M lump sum seasonal benefit issued in Nov	- Award typically received in mid-late October - Typical benefit issuance is Nov. 12th (this could be pushed back one week)

AHS Federal Funds – Potential Impacts

Federal Grant Program	Status of FFY26	Average monthly spend	Highlights
SNAP - EBT	EBT vendor FIS (Conduent subcontractor) received funding from USDA-FNS for October benefits	\$12-\$13M	- State received notice from USDA-FNS that November benefit issuance files should be delayed - AHS is actively exploring options for consideration
SNAP – EBT Cashout	\$15.8M carryforward from FFY25 award - No FFY26 award	\$3.8M	Although carryforward funding has been received, November benefit issuance may also be delayed (cannot bifurcate SNAP eligibility files)
