The Governor Issued Executive Order 03-23 and addendums directing the DMV to do the following:

- Sixty (60) day extension on all Vermont licenses
- Sixty (60) day extension on all Vermont issued registrations to include temporary registrations
- Sixty (60) day extension for new Vermont residents to transfer their license and registrations
- Extend license photo validity from nine (9) years to thirteen (13)
- Extend maximum driving time for motor carrier providing direct assistance
- Issue permits for overweight and oversize vehicles in an expedited fashion for the purposes of emergency response and infrastructure building

DMV Locations

- Montpelier office reopened to the public on August 14, 2023
 - Staff returned to the office on July 17, 2023 to process mail and online services
 - All road exams shifted to 1 National Life on July 31, 2023 Returning to Montpelier Office on October 1.
- Dummerston closed due to road damage
 - Remains closed due to staffing
- St. Johnsbury office closed due to road access and reopened on July 27, 2023
- Barre CDL testing site become the emergency Red Cross and FEMA site and reopened August 23, 2023
- Vermont Training Center in Berlin closed July 10, 2023 and has not reopened to use for motorcycle exams

Responses and Impacts

Impacts

- Created backlog in mail processing and online services, increased customer wait time in branch offices and more walk-in traffic
- South Burlington branch office had an increase in the number of walk-ins during Montpelier's closure
- Staff members were personally impacted by property loss

Responses

- Montpelier staff focused on mail and online service processing starting on July 17, 2023
 - Montpelier staff also assisted at the South Burlington, Springfield, Newport,
 Rutland, St Albans, and White River Junction offices
- Motorcycle skills tests are being conducted at Fort Ethan Allen
- All scheduled customers impacted by the flooding event were notified by telephone or e-mail so we could reschedule or direct them to online services

Responses and Impacts

Mail Service

Impacts

- Montpelier Post Office closed and experienced damaged mail
 - DMV was uncertain of lost or damaged incoming and outgoing mail (mail received the week of July 10th)
 - Post Offices in communities impacted by the flood may have experienced lost or damaged mail
 - DMV experienced delays in incoming and outgoing mail beginning July 10

DMV Response - Mail

Dealers:

- All dealers were contacted as to potential lost transactions submitted via mail and asked to provide a list of transactions submitted by mail prior to July flood
- DMV cross referenced dealer lists with internal completed transactions
- DMV identified any missing transactions and completed them

DMV Modernization Project Responses and Impacts

- Barre City Place was closed until July 20, 2023
- Project team worked remotely
- Delay in testing procedures with closing of building delay did not impact project schedule
- Project is currently on time and on budget
