Goal

As directed by the General Assembly, we are using the principles of a high-quality revenue system to pursue three objectives:

1) Analyze Vermont's tax structure

- 2) Recommend improvements and modernization
- 3) Provide a long-term vision

Purpose

We aim to evaluate Vermont's three major taxes – income, consumption, and property – as well as other revenue sources and tax expenditures. We aim to make the tax system more understandable for the public, help policymakers compare the merits of various options, and offer recommendations that can help Vermont's revenue system work better for Vermonters.

Principles		
A tax system that provides: ¹	A high-quality revenue system ² :	
Sustainability	 Comprises elements that are complementary, including the finances of both state and local governments. Produces revenue in a reliable manner, prioritizing stability, certainty, and sufficiency. Relies on a balanced variety of revenue sources. 	
Equity	 Imposes similar tax burdens on people in similar circumstances. Minimizes regressivity. Minimizes taxes on individuals with low income. 	
Appropriateness	 Is easy to understand and minimizes compliance costs. Is as simple as possible to administer, raises revenue efficiently, is administered professionally, and is applied uniformly. Is responsive to interstate and international competition. Minimizes its involvement in spending decisions and makes any such involvement explicit. Is accountable to taxpayers.
