H.814 – An act relating to neurological rights and the use of artificial intelligence technology in health and human services

As Passed by the House¹

Bill Summary

This bill would modify the membership of the Artificial Intelligence Advisory Council, extend the Council's duration from June 30, 2027 to June 30, 2030, and require the Council, in coordination with the Agency of Digital Services' (ADS) Director of the Division of Artificial Intelligence to report on the ethical and responsible use of artificial intelligence in health care, human services, and education.²

Fiscal Impact

Sec. 3 would add three new members to the Artificial Intelligence Advisory Council. Members of the Council who are not State employees and who are not otherwise compensated or reimbursed for their attendance would be entitled to compensation and expenses pursuant to 32 V.S.A. § 1010. The fiscal impact – no more than \$1,800 per year – is estimated to be de minimis and coverable under the current fiscal year 2027 ADS budget request. As such no additional appropriation is needed.
