S.154 – An act relating to health insurance coverage for biomarker testing

As Passed by the Senate¹

Bill Summary

The bill would require the Department of Financial Regulation (DFR) and the Agency of Human Services (AHS) to analyze the costs associated with requiring health insurance coverage and Medicaid coverage, respectively, for biomarker testing for the purpose of diagnosis, treatment, appropriate management, and ongoing monitoring of a patient’s disease or condition when the test is supported by medical and scientific evidence.

In addition to reporting back to the committees of jurisdictions on the impacts to health insurance premiums, Medicaid costs, and the State Employees’ Health Insurance Benefit Plan, it would also require DFR to report on the State’s financial obligations for defrayal of premium increases for qualified health plans (QHPs), pursuant to 45 C.F.R. § 155.70 which requires states to cover any additional state-required benefits (on or after January 1, 2012) to QHPs beyond what was established as the State’s Essential Health Benefit Benchmark plan.²

There are no appropriations in the bill.

Fiscal Impact

The bill would require both AHS and DFR to do analyses that would require actuaries. The analyses required of AHS could be done under their current actuarial plan design contract. However, DFR would need an appropriation – likely between \$25,000 to \$50,000 – to accomplish this work.
