S.60 – An act relating to establishing the Farm Security Special Fund to provide grants for farm losses due to weather conditions

As recommended by the Senate Committee on Appropriations, Draft 1.1^{1,2}

Bill Summary

This bill would create the Farm Security Special Fund, effective July 1, 2025, which would provide grants for up to 50 percent of uninsured or otherwise uncovered agricultural losses associated with various eligible weather conditions, such as excessive wind, rainfall, and heat. Grant awards would be capped at \$150,000. The bill would also create the Farm Security Special Fund Review Board, which would review grant applications and make recommendations as to which applicants should receive assistance from the Fund. The Secretary of Agriculture would be responsible for establishing award criteria and verifying the occurrence of eligible weather events.

Fiscal Impact

As recommended by the Senate Committee on Agriculture, the bill would appropriate \$7.5 million in fiscal year 2026 to the Agency of Agriculture, Food, and Markets to implement the newly created special fund and grant program. The Senate Committee on Appropriations recommends deleting this appropriation from the bill consistent with its typical practice of reflecting appropriations and transfers in the annual appropriations act.

The Farm Security Special Fund has no dedicated revenue source. It would consist of funds transferred by the General Assembly, funds from public and private sources that the Secretary accepts for the Fund, and funds from federal government aid for State support of farmers suffering income loss due to weather conditions. Balances in the Fund at the end of any fiscal year shall carry forward and remain in the Fund.

The five private sector members of the Farm Security Special Fund Review Board would be entitled to per diem compensation and expense reimbursement at an estimated cost of approximately \$620 per meeting.
