

Federal Outlays, FY 2019 (\$ in billions)



(\$ in billions)





Federal Funds as a Share of State Spending











How the four factors translate to dollars

Largest Federal Grants, FY 2022




Most grants are discretionary, most funding is mandatory

Continuing resolution provisions

Extends:

- TANF to February 2
- Farm bill through end of FY 2024
- Community Health Centers through January 19 and appropriates \$1.2 billion
- Funding for Sexual Risk Avoidance Education and the Personal Responsibility Education Program through January 19


Delays ACA Medicaid Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) cuts until January 19

Selected 302(b) Allocations, FY 2024


