
Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAPs)

- The FMAP is the share of state Medicaid benefit costs paid by the federal government.
- Pursuant to federal law, the Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services calculates the FMAPs each year.
- The FMAP is calculated based on a three-year average of state per capita personal income compared to the national average.
- No state can receive less than 50% or more than 83%.
- States also receive "enhanced FMAPs" for expansion populations under the ACA and for the Childrens Health Insurance Program (CHIP).



FMAP - State Fiscal Years 2000 - 2026 with Enhancements



- Vermont receives enhanced FMAP (E-FMAP) for two Medicaid Eligibility Groups (MEGs):
 - 1) New Adult (childless) = 90% (federal share) / 10%% (state share)
 - Enacted as part of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).
 - Applied to Medicaid eligible expenditures for approx. 41,000 childless adults.
 - 2) Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP, formerly known as SCHIP)
 - SFY24 E-FMAP = 69.56% (federal share) / 30.44% (state share)
 - SFY25 E-FMAP = 70.48% (federal share) / 29.52% (state share)
 - SFY26 E-FMAP = 71.17% (federal share) / 28.84% (state share)

Applied to Medicaid eligible expenditures for approx. 4,400 low-income children.
