In continuation of the email you received on October 2, 2010 pertaining to Statewide Expenditure Information, here are the reports for the remaining categories of commonly incurred expenditures across State Government. As mention before, these expenditures on the surface appear to be controllable, to a significant degree, by departments. We recognize that a department's ability to control any of these expenditures is strongly influenced by its operational mission. These categories, in addition to the In-State Travel report already received, accounted for over \$50 million in costs in FY2009. Saving as little as 10% on these categories is significant when viewed from a statewide perspective. Please keep in mind that in FY2009, agencies and departments reduced out-of-state travel expenditures alone by \$1 million dollars (35%) relative to FY2008.

Included in this group of expenditures is electricity cost. We do understand that most departments do not pay this charge directly, however it is factored into your Fee for Space billings and anything you can do locally to reduce electricity consumption will have a positive impact on statewide electricity cost.

Again, we hope you find this information helpful as we all try to manage through another tough budget year. If you have any suggestions on other expenditures that we should include in this process please let me know. We will be distributing this information again in January and March with updated year to date information.
