The services and assistance provided to eligible independent schools will be managed by the Agency of Education to support activities related to safely reopening schools, continuing instruction, and addressing learning loss, including educational technology and reimbursement for COVID-19-related costs.

9. Impact on existing program if grant is not Accepted:

This program provides critical support for independent schools to respond to COVID-19 related needs. If this program is not approved then these schools will potentially not be able to make adjustments to meet health guidelines or provide remote education and this could impact the education of children enrolled in these schools.

Attached please find AA-1 for grant funding from the U.S. Department of Education.

We are submitting this document for an expedited review. Unfortunately, we have not yet received the actual federal award from USDOE.

The purpose of the GEER EANS program is to provide services or assistance to eligible independent schools to address educational disruptions caused by COVID-19. By creating a separate reservation of funds for this purpose, Congress reiterated the need for independent schools to be able to participate in emergency education relief programs by establishing a separate program under GEER, rather than relying on the equitable services requirements that typically apply to elementary and secondary formula grant programs (such as in ESSER).

To receive services or assistance, an eligible independent school must submit an application to the AOE. Applications will be made available to eligible independent schools no later than 30 days after the state's Certification and Agreement to the US Department of Education is approved. The AOE will release this application on March 24, 2021. Further details regarding the program can be found in the GEER EANS Program Overview.

Total funds available to Vermont: \$4,284,369

Total funds available for Vermont's eligible independent schools: \$4,084,000

Period of Performance: March 13, 2020- September 30, 2023

An expedited review of this federal funding will allow the Agency to advertise a grant application process that meets the federal requirement of "no later than 30 days after the State's Certification and Agreement to the US Department of Education is approved."
