Enclosed please find five (5) requests that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration. These requests include the establishment of six (6) limited service positions and the retention of two existing positions.

JFO #2433 — \$3,999,923 grant from the U.S. Department of Labor to the Vermont Department of Labor. These funds will be used to study the demand for Green Jobs in Vermont and the northeast. Vermont will act as the lead administrative state for this collaboration with Massachusetts, Connecticut, Maine, New York, New Hampshire, and the District of Columbia. Vermont's share of this award is approximately \$530,000. The establishment of two (2) limited service positions are associated with this request, as is the retention of two existing positions. This grant is awarded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act and expedited review of this item has been requested. Joint Fiscal Committee members will be contacted within two weeks with a request to waive the statutory review period and accept this item.



RE: Limited Service Positions to Support Health Information Technology (HIT) Initiatives

As a supplement to the request for positions, this Memo provides background and context.

In the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA), Congress authorized two important Health Information Technology initiatives for which states have lead responsibility. These are: coordination of state Health Information Exchange (HIE) and implementation of a program of incentive payments for health care providers (physicians and hospitals) paid through State Medicaid agencies. The provider incentives are 100% Federal dollars but are administered by the State. These programs will result in millions of Federal dollars coming to Vermont in support of expanding implementation and meaningful use of Electronic Health Records (EHRs) and other HIT initiatives. Act 61 of 2009 placed responsibility for state oversight of these initiatives with the Division of Health Care Reform at OVHA, and the requested limited service positions are to ensure the Division can meet Federal and State statutory expectations.

The addition of these positions has been well understood and verbally approved by AHS Secretary Hofmann, AOA Secretary Lunderville, and Chief Technology Officer Esvlin through the course of discussions over the last year, since passage of ARRA and analysis of the opportunities it presents. A total of six (6) positions will be requested this year, as funding becomes available. All are shown on the organization charts included with the position requests.

The first two (Information Technology Manager I and Grants Management Specialist) are being requested now, in light of CMS' approval of our HIT Planning – Advanced Planning Document (attached) and will be focused on development of the State Medicaid HIT Plan required by CMS as a condition of the provider incentive funding. A third position (Associate CIO) will be requested shortly, upon receipt of the notice of Cooperative Agreement award from the Office of the National Coordinator (ONC) for HIT. That third position will have responsibility for overall coordination and oversight of state HIT policy and planning. The additional positions will be added as CMS approves our transition from the Planning to Implementation phase of work.

Melissa,

Here are the ARRA Sections. I am still working through the rules re the money, but these sections are in Division B of ARRA and for Section 4201 at least, they are not grants in the usual sense. From what you tell me CMS is making the money available as IT Medicaid with a 90-10 match. Since it is not an appropriation in Division A of ARRA, it is not subject to ARRA Section 1512 reporting. It must be separately reported as ARRA on our Statement of Expenditure of Federal Awards (SEFA). It must be tracked and accounted for so the auditors can identify it for audit. For us in the State system that means using the ARRA fund code and a unique VISION program code.

Toni: the complexity of this has to do w/getting our CMS funding for these positions first from a short term P-APD (Planning - Advanced Planning Document) authority, then from a longer term I-APD (Implementation - Advanced Planning Document) authority. The Federal funding for these two positions (and the other 4 on the org chart with the "2" footnote) actually runs through 2021, but we have no idea whether we'll need the positions for that length of time. But 90/10 funding for them all is guaranteed through 2021.

Dear Secretary Hofmann:

This letter is in response to your request for approval of a Planning Advance Planning Document (PADP) for activities associated with the State's planning activities for the implementation of the Health Information Technology (HIT) provision of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (the Recovery Act). These activities are to include the development of a State Medicaid HIT Plan (SMHP) that will be submitted for review by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and the Office of National Coordinator of Health Information Technology (ONC).

We have reviewed the information contained in the request and find that the requirements of Section 4201 of the Recovery Act and the guidance found in the State Medicaid Director Letter (SMD) 09-006/ARRA HIT #1.

The Vermont Health Information Technology (HIT) Planning Advance Planning Document is approved. The State can claim Federal Financial Participation (FFP) for the activities contained in the PAPD as follows:

• 90 percent FFP in an amount not to exceed \$293,998 in State personnel costs.

Final determination of allowable costs and matching FFP will be conditioned upon successful fulfillment of the objectives presented in the PAPD. Specific condition in determining the final allowability of FFP will include review and acceptance of the SMHP by CMS and the submission, approval and implementation of an Implementation Planning Advance Document (IAPD) based on the outcome of these planning activities. 
