Response to the Rep. Obuchowski's questions regarding JFO #2255.

1) If the grant is so necessary for these law enforcement entities to communicate, why has it take so long in submission to us?

Excellent question - one my staff has been asking for some time. The approval process for this grant has been plagued with problems. I asked for this grant back in February 2005. I was notified that an earmark had been included in the FFY 05 budget. I subsequently applied for the grant in May of 2005. In August I was notified of the official award but never received any further paperwork or notification. In the meantime other issues and grants took up our time. In January of 2006 I began following up to find out the whereabouts of this grant by going directly to an assistant director in BJA. At that time I found out that the award had been posted to an electronic grant tracking system. Once I found out how to access this site and get the forms and necessary information for signature I did so. I then sent the paperwork to DPS administration on 2/2/06, it left here for Finance and Management on 2/24/06, and I was notified that JFO had received it on 3/30/06.

2) How far along are you on the schedule to get this program implemented?

The issue of communicating between disparate CAD/RM systems is a more complicated issue. We are partnering with Burlington Police Department to work on this issue and have gone out (under Burlington Police Departments name) with a request for information to determine what the type of software and the cost to implement a data sharing system. While Burlington wants to aggressively move forward with this project it needs to be accomplished within the context of our (the State) greater criminal justice information sharing project. However, specifically, there is a small committee of law enforcement agencies from Chittenden County that is working on the law enforcement information sharing piece of this problem. Most of the rest of the state is using the Spillman software system and Burlington PD, S. Burlington PD, and UVM Police are using a software vendor called New World. In summary we are not progressing at a fast enough pace.

The purchase of equipment is awaiting approval, no funds have been expended as of yet. We have prepared the specifications for the dual server hardware in anticipation of this approval. We have begun the sole source approval request to hire Spillman Technologies to move their proprietary Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management (CAD/RM) software from the old servers to the new servers. We are now preparing the specifications for the Network Attached Storage

equipment.

Dear Mr. Sleeper:

Congratulations on your recent award. In establishing financial assistance programs, Congress linked the receipt of Federal funding to compliance with Federal civil rights laws. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice is responsible for ensuring that recipients of financial aid from OJP, its component offices and bureaus, the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) comply with applicable Federal civil rights statutes and regulations. We at OCR are available to help you and your organization meet the civil rights requirements that come with Justice Department funding.

As you know, Federal laws prohibit recipients of financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in funded programs or activities, not only in respect to employment practices but also in the delivery of services or benefits. Federal law also prohibits funded programs or activities from discriminating on the basis of age in the delivery of services or benefits.

In addition to these general prohibitions, your organization, which is a recipient of financial assistance subject to the nondiscrimination provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act (Safe Streets Act) of 1968, 42 U.S.C. § 3789d(c), must meet two additional requirements:(1) complying with Federal regulations pertaining to the development of an Equal Employment Opportunity Plan (EEOP), 28 C.F.R. § 42.301-.308, and (2) submitting to OCR Findings of Discrimination (see 28 C.F.R. §§ 42.205(5) or 31.202(5)).

Complying with the EEOP Requirement

In accordance with Federal regulations, and Assurance No. 6 in the Standard Assurances, your organization must comply with the following EEOP reporting requirements:

If your organization has received an award for \$500,000 or more and has 50 or more employees (counting both full- and part-time employees but excluding political appointees), then it has to prepare an EEOP and submit it to OCR for review within 60 days from the date of this letter. For assistance in developing an EEOP, please consult OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/. You may also request technical assistance from an EEOP specialist at OCR by dialing (202) 616-3208.

If your organization received an award between \$25,000 and \$500,000 and has 50 or more employees, your organization still has to prepare an EEOP, but it does not have submit the EEOP to OCR for review. Instead, your organization has to maintain the EEOP on file and make it available for review on request. In addition, your organization has to complete Section B of the enclosed Certification Form and return it to OCR.

If your organization received an award for less than \$25,000; or if your organization has less than 50 employees, regardless of the amount of the award; or if your organization is a medical institution, educational institution, nonprofit organization or Indian tribe, then your organization is exempt from the EEOP requirement. However, your organization must complete Section A of the enclosed Certification Form and return it to OCR.

Submitting Findings of Discrimination

In the event a Federal or State court or Federal or State administrative agency makes an adverse finding of discrimination against your organization after a due process hearing, on the ground of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex, your organization must submit a copy of the finding to OCR for review.

Providing Services to Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Individuals

In accordance with recent Department of Justice Guidance pertaining to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d, recipients of Federal financial assistance must take reasonable steps to provide meaningful access to their programs and activities for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP). Ensuring the Compliance of Subrecipients

If your organization makes subawards to other agencies, you are responsible for assuring that subrecipients also comply with all of the applicable Federal civil rights laws, including the requirements pertaining to developing and submitting an EEOP, reporting Findings of Discrimination, and providing language services to LEP persons. State agencies that make subawards must have in place standard grant assurances and review procedures to demonstrate that they are effectively monitoring the civil rights compliance of subrecipients.

Enforcing Civil Rights Laws

All recipients of Federal financial assistance, regardless of the particular funding source, the amount of the grant award, or the number of employees in the workforce, are subject to the prohibitions against unlawful discrimination. Accordingly, OCR investigates recipients that are the subject of discrimination complaints from both individuals and groups. In addition, based on regulatory criteria, OCR selects a number of recipients each year for compliance reviews, audits that require recipients to submit data showing that they are providing services equitably to all segments of their service population and that their employment practices meet equal employment opportunity standards.

Ensuring Equal Treatment for Faith-Based Organizations

The Department of Justice has published a regulation specifically pertaining to the funding of faith-based organizations. In general, the regulation, 28 C.F.R. part 38, requires State Administering Agencies to treat these organizations the same as any other applicant or recipient. The regulation prohibits State Administering Agencies from making award or grant administration decisions on the basis of an organization's religious character or affiliation, religious name, or the religious composition of its board of directors.

The regulation also prohibits faith-based organizations from using direct financial assistance from the Department of Justice to fund inherently religious activities. While faith-based organizations can engage in non-funded inherently religious activities, they must be held separately from the Department of Justice funded program, and customers or beneficiaries cannot be compelled to participate in them. The Equal Treatment Regulation also makes clear that organizations participating in programs directly funded by the Department of Justice are not permitted to discriminate in the provision of services on the basis of a beneficiary's religion. For more information on the regulation, please see OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/etfbo.htm.

State Administering Agencies and faith-based organizations should also note that the Safe Streets Act, as amended; the Victims of Crime Act, as amended; and the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, as amended, contain prohibitions against discrimination on the basis of religion in employment. These employment provisions have been specifically incorporated into 28 C.F.R. Part 38.1(f) and 38.2(f). Consequently, in many circumstances, it would be impermissible for faith-based organizations seeking or receiving funding authorized by these statutes to have policies or practices that condition hiring and other employment-related decisions on the religion of applicants or employees. Programs subject to these nondiscrimination provisions may be found on OCR's website at http://www.ojp.usdoj.gov/ocr/. Questions about the regulation or the statutes that prohibit discrimination in employment may be directed to this Office.

Awards under this program will be used to develop national demonstration, training, and technical assistance programs.

None of the following activities will be conducted either under the OJP federal action or a related third party action:

(1) new construction;

(2) any renovation or remodeling of a property either (a) listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, or (b) located within a 100-year flood plain;

(3) a renovation that will change the basic prior use of a facility or significantly change its size;
(4) research and technology whose anticipated and future application could be expected to have an effect on the environment; and

(5) implementation of a program involving the use of chemicals.

Consequently, an agency-wide analysis has determined that the program meets the Office of Justice Programs' (OJP) criteria for a categorical exclusion under the provisions of 28 CFR, Part 61, Appendix D, paragraph 4(b).

The Vermont Department of Public Safety operates a centralized computer aided dispatch and records management system (CAD/RMS) for approximately 80 users throughout the state. The Department of Public Safety needs to provide network services that are reliable however the system is becoming old, is lacking in performance, is not redundant, and is in need of replacement. This grant will allow the department to upgrade key components of the system such as the disk array and mail server.

Further, over the past 5 years our centralized Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management System (CAD/RMS) has become fragmented. We once had most of the largest police departments using the same system we now have lost the some of the larger organizations, Burlington PD, S. Burlington PD and the University of Vermont Police Department to their own CAD/RMS. We need to identify a way of sharing the basic law incident information that we once shared and create a solution to allow for basic law enforcement information sharing.

A. Assessment of existing problems

1.

The Department of Public Safety provides shared, centralized Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management (CAD/RMS) applications that are used to record and track all types of requests for service (incidents) that law enforcement agencies receive. The centralized system provides services to 80 or so entities around the state. The shared CAD system fosters very high levels of data sharing. Separate and independent departments are allowed to view case information that was developed by another agency. One recent review by an entity dedicated to justice information sharing stated that Vermont's shared CAD system was an "extraordinary integration achievement. In addition to CAD and Rcds, miscellaneous other services are shared amongst the agencies, including email and other applications such as scheduling.

Some of the key hardware supporting these applications is old, at end of life, and is not performing adequately. In particular, the first item, the disk array is at end of life and is in need of replacement. The second item is the mail server supporting the CAD and Rcds system. The system is old, is lacking in performance, is not redundant, and is in need of replacement.

Further, over the past 5 years our centralized Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management System (CAD/RMS) has become fragmented. We once had all of the largest police department using the same system we now have lost the some of the larger organizations, Burlington PD, S. Burlington PD and the University of Vermont Police Department to their own CAD/RMS. We need to identify a way of sharing the basic law incident information that we once shared

B. Project Goals and Objectives

The goals of the project are to update and modernize the most necessary critical hardware that supports the collaborate information sharing being provided through the centralized CAD and Rcds system. The objective is provide reliable, quality services, to customers so that they remain committed to a centralized system that supports data sharing amongst all law enforcement parties.

Another goal is to establish an information sharing system between the disparate law enforcement CAD/RM systems.

C. Implementation Plans*

The request is for discrete hardware products and as such they will be implemented in a manner that will essentially replace the old, end of life hardware. A combination of inhouse and contract help will handle the replacement process.

The Department of Public Safety will also lead a small committee to develop exchange points of information for the disparate CAD/RM systems and develop an RFP for a system to share information. \$100,000 is being identified from this grant and is being put together with \$100,000 for a grant received by the Burlington Police Department and a \$100,000 grant from the State of Vermont's homeland security grant for a total of \$300,000 towards this information sharing portion of this grant application.

D. Evaluation Plans/Outcomes/Effectiveness of Programs

As replacement hardware the success of the process will be immediately apparent. The average number of processes in queue, the fail over capability and generally improved performance will be improvements and acceptable outcomes.

An outcome of this grant is the framework, through the development of exchange points, an RFP and a system for the sharing of CAD/RMS information.

11. **Budget Narrative**

Item 1 Equipment Page

Network attached storage unit is a central data storage unit that handles all types of system data. The system delivers interoperability between various operating systems and is designed to insure reliability, availability, and performance.

\$100,000 is also being identified for the purposes of purchasing software for a system to share law enforcement CAD/RMS information.

Item 2 Equipment Page

Dual server hardware is an upgrade for the existing server. This is a dual server Unix platform for supporting the statewide CAD and records system. It is designed for power, reliability and high availability.

The intent of this line item is to work towards purchasing software that will allow for information sharing between law enforcement agencies using different CAD/RMS. It is unknown at this time what type of software will be purchased. The funds set aside in this grant will be used along with other funding sources to acquire the software facilitate this information sharing initiative
