Enclosed please find six (6) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration.

JFO #2718 – \$10,000 grant from the Consumers Union to the Vermont Department of Finance and Management. These funds will cover a portion of the costs associated with implementation and administration of the new law that requires labeling of food produced from genetic engineering. The donated funds will be deposited in the Vermont Food Fight Fund.

JFO #2719 – \$15,000 grant from the Consumers Union Action Fund (separate from above) to the Vermont Department of Finance and Management. These funds will cover a portion of the costs associated with implementation and administration of the new law that requires labeling of food produced from genetic engineering. The donated funds will be deposited in the Vermont Food Fight Fund.

JFO #2720 – \$250,000 grant from the Northern Border Regional Commission to the Vermont Agency of Transportation. These funds will be used to install a 2,500 foot rail siding for a new Washington County Railroad (WCRR) transload facility near the town of Barton, VT. The total project cost is estimated at \$382,120, of which, \$63,350 will be paid from in-kind contributions from the WCRR and \$68,770 will be derived from the value of state-owned rail assets, with the remainder being funded by the grant.

JFO #2721 – \$95,126 grant from the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services to the Vermont Agency of Human Services. These funds will be applied to the Agency's Refugee Targeted Assistance Program to supplement services already provided to refugees in Vermont. These services are geared towards making refugees economically self-sufficient as soon as possible after arriving in the U.S. through English language training and employment services.

JFO #2722 – \$39,978 donation from the Vermont National Guard to the State of Vermont. These funds were previously appropriated to the Military Department in 2004 and 2005 as part of a

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larger funding package to assist military members in emergency situations. Since that time, the Vermont National Guard Charitable Foundation (VTNGCF) has been established with ample funding to support its mission and the remaining State funds are no longer needed. The donation will be deposited into the General Fund.

JFO #2723 - \$13,500 grant from Keurig Green Mountain to the Vermont Agency of Human Services. This grant will fund a volunteer coordinator position in the SerVermont program to organize volunteers for projects to improve the water quality of Lake Champlain. The position will be funded for one year.

Subject: Rescission of funds

Good afternoon David.

Based on Sec. 16a of No. 80 of the Acts of 2004 and later amended by the 2005 Budget Adjustment Act, the Military Department was funded with \$200K to support the emergency needs of Vermont National Guard and Reserve members on active duty. These funds were deposited into a bank account with People's United Bank which 10 years later has a current balance of \$39,978.90 (bank statement attached).

The Military Department is proposing that these funds be donated to the General Fund and that the current bank account be closed. There was a very critical need for these funds during a 5-6 year period immediately following 9-11. The Vermont National Guard routinely had military members activated and deployed around the world and didn't have a vehicle to assist military members emergency situations (e.g. roofs, boilers, car repairs, transportation to visit wounded family being rehabilitated in hospitals around the country, and financial hardship because of pay disparities, etc.). So, as part of the 2004 legislative language the Vermont National Guard Family Emergency Fund was established.

Since that time a non-profit organization called the Vermont National Guard Charitable Foundation (VTNGCF) was established and operates independent of the Vermont National Guard and the Military Department. The organization has several missions, one being a grants and needs committee. The committee is made up of community members, volunteer military members (current and retired) and is generously supported by the public and community leaders. This group has a very close relationship with the Vermont National Guard Family Readiness Program which is the conduit for the VTNGCF to receive grant request, The Family Readiness Program Coordinators are situated in locations all around the state and have routine interaction. They have become the first line of defense to work with the military member and their families if support is needed. If they identify someone that is having a financial hardship, the Family Readiness Program Coordinators facilitate the application process and make sure that the VTNGCF receives all the necessary information to be able to act on the request very promptly. With the VTNGCF, the Grants and Needs committee accepts, reviews and issues (who applies for the grants?) grants that support military members that have financial needs or are impaired by other hardships. The VTNGCF has been able to expand its role to support all military members whether deployed or home station. The organization supports/facilitates everything from rent, mortgages, utility bills, car repairs, major house repairs; to hospital beds and chairlifts for disabled veterans; to care packages for deployed members; to social events such as the 2012 Christmas Party at the Sheraton Hotel that hosted over 1,000 members and their spouses.

The VTNGCF is well established and can sustain its mission for the foreseeable future. The current balance is approximately \$700k. I am a member of the VTNGCF board and participate on the finance committee.

The VTNGCF has rendered the Vermont National Guard Family Emergency Fund obsolete and the Vermont Taxpayers would be better served in this resourceconstrained environment to have these funds returned to the GF.

Let me know what I need to do the get this process started.
