No Joint Fiscal Committee member has requested that the following items be held for review:

JFO #2539 – \$52,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to the Vermont Department of Disabilities, Aging and Independent Living. These funds will reimburse four area agencies on aging for expenses incurred during their response to Tropical Storm Irene. [JFO received 11/21/11]

**JFO #2540** – Donation of land valued at \$93,343 from the Vermont Electric Power Company (VELCO) to the Vermont Department of Fish and Wildlife. The amount of the donation represents the appraised value of a 286.7 acre parcel in Athens and Grafton. The parcel will provide permanent protection of public access for public hunting, trapping, fishing, wildlife viewing, as well as wildlife conservation. The donation is part of a larger property acquisition that has been approved by the Governor. [*JFO received 11/21/11*]

JFO #2541 – \$453,279 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used to help Vermont farmers meet requirements under the Clean Water Act by supporting four positions (3 existing) focused on completing manure and wastewater management systems. One limited service position is associated with this request. [JFO received 11/21/11]

JFO #2542 – \$96,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used to support **one limited service position** to work with agricultural and environmental partners on developing work plans and reporting outcomes of efforts to address water quality goals. [*JFO received 11/21/11*]

The Governor's approval may now be considered final. We ask that you inform the Secretary of Administration and your staff of this action.

**RE:** Request for Approval by the Governor for the Fee Acquisition of Two Adjoining Properties and the Acceptance as a Donation of a Third Adjoining Property in the Towns of Athens and Grafton, Vermont.

Enclosed is a request for approval by Governor Shumlin for the acquisition of two properties and the acceptance as a donation of a third property totaling 560 acres in the towns of Athens and Grafton, Vermont that will be used to create a new Wildlife Management Area to conserve significant wildlife habitat and public access for all wildlife-based activities. The Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department (VFWD) is acquiring these three parcels to provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, fishing, wildlife viewing, other wildlife dependent activities and conservation of significant wildlife habitat including a large complex of wetland habitats. The Athens Dome Wetland Complex will protect habitat for the federally endangered Northeastern bulrush (*Scirpus ancistrochaetus*), as well as undeveloped forest and wetlands across three adjacent properties owned by David Bemis, The Nature Conservancy and VELCO. The total budget for the project is \$443,343. The majority of the funding for the project, \$300,000, will come from federal funding to recover federally endangered species habitat with the match for the federal funds coming from a land donation valued at \$93,343 and \$50,000 from Duck Stamp Funds.

Included with the request for Governor approval are a map of the properties and copies of the letters signed by both the Athens and Grafton Select Boards stating town support for the state acquisition of these parcels.

SUBJECT:	Fee Acquisition by the Vermont Fish & Wildlife Department of 3 properties in the towns of Athens and Grafton, VT to create a Wildlife Management Area.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Approve the purchase of two properties and accept, as a donation, a third property totaling 560 acres in the towns of Athens and Grafton, Vermont that will constitute a Wildlife Management Area to conserve wildlife habitat and provide public access for all wildlife-based activities.

#### Description of Project

This project, referred to as the Athens Dome Wetland Acquisition, will result in the conservation of over 560 acres of undeveloped forest and wetlands across three adjacent properties owned by David Bemis, The Nature Conservancy and VELCO (See Exhibit 1). The project is located in the towns of Athens and Grafton which are part of the Southern Vermont Piedmont region. Many of the state's rare, threatened, or endangered plants occur in very restricted habitats and are associated with the Champlain Valley and the Southern Piedmont regions of Vermont due to their unique, warm climate. Current rates of human population expansion and land use conversion place an even greater urgency for the conservation of at-risk species within these regions of the state, as they are the fastest growing regions in the state for development. The Southern Vermont Piedmont is also a region that is receiving less overall attention by the conservation community in Vermont. While 19.2% of Vermont land is currently conserved either by federal, state, municipal, or private conservation groups, only 8% of the Southern Vermont Piedmont is conserved as such. Therefore, this represents a unique and significant opportunity for public ownership of an ecologically rich area that also affords outstanding opportunities for public access for hunting, fishing, trapping, wildlife viewing and more.

The Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department (VFWD), with funding and support from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, is interested in conserving the Athens Dome Wetland Complex for a variety of reasons. Importantly, the wetlands on these properties support the federally-endangered Northeastern bulrush (*Scirpus ancistrochaetus*) which is known to occur in two locations within the project area. Numerous beaver-influenced wetlands provide ideal habitat for the Northeastern bulrush. This project also provides a unique

opportunity to conserve a large area of upper elevation watershed. In addition, there is a commitment to monitor the northeastern bulrush populations and their associated habitat over time to inform management decisions and to direct additional conservation priorities in the area.

A project of this scale also provides many additional fish and wildlife and public benefits including:

- The protection of five pristine and undeveloped ponds, and the majority of their watershed that provide excellent fish and wildlife habitat. Two otters were observed on a site visit utilizing the pond on the south end of the VELCO lands.
- The protection of a large block of intact forest land which provides habitat for neo-tropical migrant birds, moose, bear, fisher, beaver and other species identified in Vermont's Wildlife Action Plan<sup>1</sup> as Species of Greatest Conservation Need.
- Conservation ownership that will ensure public access for low-impact, compatible recreation, including hiking, nature study, hunting and fishing in an area with little public ownership.
- The protection of prominent ridgeline that provides the scenic backdrop to several communities in Vermont.
- The protection of significant cultural resources on the property. While working on the conservation of the properties, the Department identified the Turner Farmstead property and the Birchdale Camp structures on the property which are highly significant historic resources related to the heritage of African Americans in Vermont.

#### Need and Cost

The VFWD is acquiring three parcels to provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, fishing, wildlife viewing, other wildlife dependent activities and conservation of significant wildlife habitat including the beaver wetlands.

<u>Purchase of the 78.77 acre from The Nature Conservancy (TNC).</u> The appraisal value of the TNC parcel is \$88,000. The VFWD will buy the property from TNC for \$88,000.

<u>Acceptance of the 286.7 acre VELCO property.</u> The appraised value of the VELCO parcel is \$93,343.20. The property will be donated to the VFWD and used a match to leverage the federal funds. 5 acres have been excluded from the appraised value so that the federal grant conditions do not apply there. The 5 acres were designed to include the Area of Potential Effect (APE) around the cultural resources on the property. This was designed to give the VFWD the flexibility over time to transfer out the APE area to a more appropriate steward of the cultural resources.

<u>Purchase of the 195 acre from David Bemis.</u> The Department is under contract to purchase a 195-acre portion of the Bemis property in the town of Athens. The VFWD completed an appraisal and valued the property at \$170,000.

The total cost for the project is \$443,343.20. The majority of the funding for the project, \$300,000, will come from federal funding to recover federally endangered species habitat

with the match for the federal funds coming from a land donation valued at \$93,343 and \$50,000 from Duck Stamp Funds.

Your approval of these acquisitions are required by 10 V.S.A. §4144, that states in part "the secretary, with approval of the governor, may exchange, sell or lease lands under the secretary's jurisdiction when, in his or her judgment, it is advantageous to the state to do so …". This project has already been reviewed and approved by the Agency's Land Acquisition Review Committee at their meeting in January 2008. In addition, the towns of Athens and Grafton support this project as documented in the letters from the Select Boards (Exhibit 2).

#### APPROVAL FOR PURCHASE OF LAND

We the undersigned, hereby approve the purchase of land by the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources, Fish and Wildlife Department to protect public access and the natural resources on 560 acres across three parcels that comprise the Athens Dome Wetland Complex. This approval is required by 10 V.S.A. §4144 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.


