JFO #2680 – Donation of 0.03 acres of land (estimated value: \$5,000) from Steve and Jane Glass to the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife. Located in Craftsbury, this donation will provide public access to Great Hosmer Pond for fishing, hunting, trapping, wildlife viewing and watercraft launching. State funds in the amount of \$1,750 (special funds) will be used, along with federal funds, to cover closing costs, etc. [JFO received 04/25/14]

.IFO #2681 – Donation of 10 acres of land (estimated value: \$27,500) from Engineers Construction. Inc. to the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife. Located in Wolcott, this donation will provide public access to the Lamoille River for fishing, hunting, trapping, wildlife viewing, and protect riparian, wetland and forested habitat. State funds in the amount of \$250 (special funds) will be used, along with federal funds, to cover closing costs, etc.

Governor's Approval recommended and requested for the acceptance of a donation of a parcel located

in the Town of Craftsbury.

Enclosed is a request for Governor Shumlin's approval and signature for the acceptance of a parcel of land totaling 0.03 acres from Steven and Jane Glass of Williston, VT to the State of Vermont. The addition of this parcel, located in the Town of Craftsbury, to the Fish and Wildlife Department's (FWD) Fishing Access Area program will permanently guarantee public access to Great Hosmer Pond for fishing, hunting, trapping, wildlife viewing and watercraft launching. Total costs for this project are approximately \$7,000 which include surveying, attorney fees and closing costs.

Funding for the associated costs of this donation will come from the FWD's Access Area Funds. Included with the Governor's approval memo are a map of the property, a copy of the review and approval by the Agency Land Acquisition Review Committee and a copy of a letter signed by the Craftsbury Select Board stating town support for the state acquisition of this parcel.

Recommendation Approval of the acceptance of a 0.03-acre donation from Steven and Jane Glass of Williston, VT to the Fish and Wildlife Department (FWD) to guarantee public access at 138-acre Great Hosmer Pond located in Craftsbury and Albany.

Description of Project

The Fisheries Division is responsible for management of Riparian Lands, unimproved access points and developed Access Areas along waters throughout Vermont. For well over half a century the Department has managed a program that acquires fee interest in lake, pond and riverfront lands to provide public access to the waters of the State. The Department has been successful though these acquisitions in guaranteeing public boating access to nearly all major lakes, as well as to most of Vermont's smaller lakes and ponds. There are exceptions where public access is poor or inconvenient due to the character of the land the Department owns, is tenuous because access points are in the hands of other public or private entities, or is simply non-existent. The Fisheries Division finds it in the public's interest to seek opportunities for targeted acquisition of additional shorefront lands to establish access where it is lacking, strengthen public access rights where they are weak, and improve access conditions where they are sub-optimal.

Great Hosmer Pond is a large natural pond (138 acres) augmented in size by a dam owned by the State of Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Despite the DEC's ownership of the dam, there is no State or other public ownership on the pond that guarantees public access, and in fact the State's right-of-way to the dam (reconstructed at public expense in 2012) is for dam operation, maintenance and repair only, and does not permit general public access. There is a small (0.03-acre) site privately owned by Steven and Jane Glass of Williston, VT on the east shore of the pond that has been serving the public as a minimally improved boating access. The Glass family has a strong commitment to public access to the pond, but fears that if they were to sell their Great Hosmer camp, the guarantee of future public access would be uncertain. The
