Grant Requests

Enclosed please find four (4) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration, including the establishment of four (4) limited service positions.

JFO #2603 – \$100,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used to support the Farm to School program by providing technical assistance to schools and strengthening regional food hubs that increase purchasing of local food by schools.

JFO #2604 – \$300,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce to the Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development. These funds will be used to develop a long-term strategic economic development plan for Vermont.

JFO #2605 – \$1,450,775 grant from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used to prevent foodborne illness outbreaks through a variety of activities, including improved testing procedures and capacity and increased collaboration between state and federal agencies. Three (3) limited service positions are associated with this request. [JFO received 12/11/12]

JFO #2606 – \$3,565,584 grant from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used to reduce underage drinking and prescription drug abuse among young people by strengthening the state's prevention infrastructure consistent with Vermont's Strategic Prevention Framework. Six community grantees will plan, implement and evaluate a range of prevention interventions. One (1) limited service position is associated with this request. [JFO received 12/11/12]

Brief narrative for USDA Farm to School grant with VAAFM As requested by Joint Fiscal

The Vermont Agency of Agriculture will work with four regional food hubs (servicing 56 schools), VT FEED partner Northeast Organic Farming Association of VT (NOFA-VT), University of Vermont (UVM) Extension, and UVM Center for Rural Studies over 18 months starting in December 2012 to: strengthen the regional support structure for farmers and food service staff, create a community of practice among regional food hubs focused on school food procurement, and better demonstrate models of how regional food hubs support FTS programs and increase purchasing of local foods by schools.

The partnership, led by the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets, will hold monthly conference calls to report on progress and next steps and connect with other food system partners. The Agency in collaboration with project partners will determine the best practices of regional food hubs engaged in Farm to School. The Agency will use the outcomes to develop outreach materials that will be used to facilitate regional food hubs incorporating the best practices into Farm to School programming.

All food hubs will organize regional matchmaker events to connect local producers to school food buyers, hold regional food safety and school food procurement training for farmers, and coordinate outreach efforts to schools in various forms (i.e. marketing materials, local food guides), and refine or develop aggregation and distribution systems.

As the only statewide Farm to School technical assistance provider, VT FEED will also act as advisor/mentor for the two hubs that do not have as extensive experience working with the school food market. VT FEED will work in collaboration with UVM Extension to provide a food safety and school food procurement workshop in each participating region.
