At the December 19, 2008 meeting of the Joint Fiscal Committee, the following grant requests were approved:

JFO #2352 — \$807,500 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to the Vermont Agency of Human Services - Department of Health.

Attached please find seven (7) requests which the Joint Fiscal Office recently received from the Administration:

JFO #2360 — \$2,000,000 grant from Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to the Agency of Human Services — Department of Mental Health. These grant funds will be used to improve access to mental health services for transition-aged (16-21 years) youth. The goal of this project is for these youth to have adequate preparation and the necessary supports to be productively engaged in the community and free from incarceration.

JFO #2361 — \$21,000 grant from the State Justice Institute (SJI) to the Judiciary. These grant funds will be used to contract for consultant services to develop an action plan for strengthening the state court system's foreign-language interpreter program, including meeting due process requirements and improving access to court-ordered programs and services.

JFO #2362 — \$32,125 grant from the U.S. Department of Education to the Vermont Department of Education. These grant funds will be used to assist local operation agencies in implementing the interstate electronic exchange of migrant children's records through the Migrant Student Information Exchange (MSIX). Implementation of MSIX is federally required.

JFO #2363 — \$166,160 grant from the Center for Applied and Special Technology to the Vermont Department of Education. These grant funds will be used to provide training and technical assistance for assistance technology services to students with disabilities.

JFO #2364 — \$12,000 grant from the National Governor's Association to the Agency of Human Services – Department of Children and Families. These grant funds will be used to host the Governor's Summit on Poverty and Economic Opportunity. This grant provides support for technical assistance, planning, holding, and follow-up activities associated with the April 20, 2009 meeting.

JFO #2365 — \$19,140 donation from the Vermont Veterinary Medical Association (VVMA) to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. VVMA is donating a Companion Animal Medical Emergency Trailer (CAMET) and associated supplies to house 50 dogs and cats in case their owners are relocated during an emergency. The value of this item represents the cumulative value of the vehicle and supplies, as well as the cost of transporting the CAMET to Vermont.

JFO #2366 — \$500,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to the Agency of Transportation – Department of Motor Vehicles. These grant funds will be used to fund enhancements to offset costs associated with implementation of the Enhanced Driver's License / Identification Card, including meeting Real ID requirements.

- 1) CAST hereby awards a cost reimbursable subaward, as described above, to Collaborator. - 3) CAST shall reimburse Collaborator not more often than monthly for allowable costs. All invoices shall be submitted using Collaborator's standard invoice, but at a minimum shall include current and cumulative costs (including cost sharing), subaward number, and certification as to truth and accuracy of invoice. *Invoices that do not reference CAST's subaward number shall be returned to Collaborator.* Invoices and questions concerning invoice receipt or payments should be directed to the appropriate party's Financial Contact, as shown in Attachment 3.
- 4) A final statement of cumulative costs incurred, including cost sharing, marked "FINAL," must be submitted to CAST's Financial Contact NOT LATER THAN thirty (30) days after subaward end date. The final statement of costs shall constitute Collaborator's final financial report.
- 5) All payments shall be considered provisional and subject to adjustment within the total estimated cost in the event such adjustment is necessary as a result of an adverse audit finding against the Collaborator.
- 6) The Collaborator shall adhere to the attached budget. Each line item is not to exceed a difference of 25% unless approval is granted by CAST.
- 7) Matters concerning the technical performance of this subaward should be directed to the appropriate party's Project Director, as shown in Attachment 3. Technical reports are required as shown above, "Reporting Requirements."
- 8) Matters concerning the request or negotiation of any changes in the terms, conditions, or amounts cited in this subaward agreement, and any changes requiring prior approval, should be directed to the appropriate party's Administrative Contact, as shown in Attachment 3. Any such changes made to this subaward agreement require the written approval of each party's Authorized Official, as shown in Attachment 3.







Purpose: To improve academic outcomes for all students with print disabilities, focusing on the key elements for timely and appropriate access to instructional materials. Specifically, VT proposes to develop and implement a professional development project designed to improve the capacity of local education agencies to understand NIMAS/NIMAC regulations. School districts will appropriately identify students with print disabilities. LEA's will effectively implement the process to acquire specialized formats and use technology tools to help students progress in the general education curriculum.

Benefit: The VT AIM Project will assist with the coordination and implementation of these required activities. The personnel at the AIM Consortium will assist with networking, cost containment and content expertise for the professional development of VT educators and "accessible instructional materials". The technical assistance and resources provided by this consortium will allow the VT DOE to use to increase capacity to deliver accessible instructional materials, in a timely manner to students in VT who have qualifying print disabilities. The professional development is designed to be delivered on a regional basis, will increase local knowledge and reduce a gaps in the delivery of assistive technology services. The web based technical assistance and resources will ensure ongoing access to resources and professional development regardless of geography, weather and road conditions. Vermont students and educators will benefit form the opportunity to join the AIM consortium. The technical assistance and collaborative design of the national project model is well matched to the VT DOE's strategic plan for assistive technology in the K-12 school system.

The Vermont Department of Education will develop and sustain a system of technical assistance and professional development targeting the provision of accessible print material to students with disabilities in Vermont. Additionally, the VT DOE will:

- 1. Create a policy that defines what it means to provide required coursework materials to students with a print disability in an accessible format in as timely a period as non-disabled students receive their materials.
- 2. Convene an advisory committee to provide advice to the Department of Education regarding the implementation of the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Standards (NIMAS)
- 3. Enhance technical assistance resources that will provide support to educators and community members to get information, ask questions and problem solve around NIMAS/NIMAS issues. The website will be supported by assigned VT DOE staff via a threaded discussion. The site will be supported to identify trends, and guarantee accuracy of information Web based technical assistance and resources that will:

Topics will include (but be limited to):

- Information on NIMAS, the Chafee amendment Identification
- Guidance on what is meant by "a print disability that has an organic origin" and the organic/medical diagnosis.
- Funding options and challenges.
- Serving students with reading disabilities who *do not* fall within the NIMAS parameters within the IDEA
- LEA purchase contracts with textbook publishers that assure the accessible codes will be made available to the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Center (NIMAC) for downloading to an Accessible Media Producer to a school for the use of a student who has an organic print disability.
- On line technical assistance and PD for general education community members about the identification of students with reading/print disabilities and providing appropriate accessible required coursework material in as timely a period. This personnel may include: Guidance counselors, library media specialists, teachers, media technicians, students and significant people in the student's living and after school environment

- 4. Secure an SEA membership and downloads from the OSEP funded BOOKSHARE.org to enhance knowledge, access and opportunity for the students with disabilities.
- 5. Collaborate with content expert consultants to conduct face to face (F2F) regional PD trainings in 5 areas in the state. Provide hands on PD opportunities for regional educational staff. This will enhance the on line PD opportunities. The F2F format will provide the hands on aspect of the learning for professionals.
- 6. Ensure that student's parents and families have easy access to information and resources regarding "accessible instructional materials" and progressing in the general educational curriculum via collaboration with the VT Parent Information Center (VT PTI).



The Accessible Instructional Materials (AIM) Consortium represents 15 states serving over 1.3 million students under IDEA, of whom over one-half million are estimated to have print disabilities. Vermont students and educators will benefit form the opportunity to join the AIM consortium. The technical assistance and collaborative design of the national project model is well matched to the VT DOE's strategic plan for assistive technology in the K-12 school system.

The Vermont Department of Education will develop and sustain a system of technical assistance and professional development targeting the provision of accessible print material to students with disabilities in Vermont. Additionally, the VT DOE will:

- 1. Create a policy that defines what it means to provide required coursework materials to students with a print disability in an accessible format in as timely a period as non-disabled students receive their materials.
- 2. Convene an advisory committee to provide advice to the Department of Education regarding the implementation of the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Standards (NIMAS)

- LEA purchase contracts with textbook publishers that assure the accessible codes will be made available to the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Center (NIMAC) for downloading to an Accessible Media Producer to a school for the use of a student who has an organic print disability.
- On line technical assistance and PD for general education community
 members about the identification of students with reading/print disabilities
 and providing appropriate accessible required coursework material in as
 timely a period. This personnel may include: Guidance counselors, library
 media specialists, teachers, media technicians, students and significant
 people in the student's living and after school environment

- 4. Secure an SEA membership and downloads from the OSEP funded BOOKSHARE.org to enhance knowledge, access and opportunity for the students with disabilities.
- 5. Collaborate with content expert consultants to conduct face to face (F2F) regional PD trainings in 5 areas in the state. Provide hands on PD opportunities for regional educational staff. This will enhance the on line PD opportunities. The F2F format will provide the hands on aspect of the learning for professionals.
- 6. Ensure that student's parents and families have easy access to information and resources regarding "accessible instructional materials" and progressing in the general educational curriculum via collaboration with the VT Parent Information Center (VT PTI).
