Vermont Department of Liquor Control 2011 Educational Award

Project Description

Summary:

The Vermont Department of Liquor Control has elected to replicate our colleague's efforts in the State of Mississippi. Last year, they created, published and distributed nearly 20,000 copies of a teen informational guide (or what we will be calling the Teen Prevention Guide) to all Mississippi middle and high schools. These guidebooks are of a high quality, glossy nature and contain information on alcohol prevention and a wide array of topics targeted to youth.

Here in Vermont, we will be including information on myths and facts about alcohol; fake identification; alcohol poisoning; party survival guide; peer pressure and bullying.

As required by our policies and procedures, we will be requesting quotes from authorized printers for the guidebooks. We expect the completion time for the printing to be quite short as we have created other publications in the past for public consumption.

We will be working with our school counselors, community prevention specialists and others within the school environment to make sure the content is both timely and age specific.

Criteria:

- 1. The guidebook will assist Vermont youth in making well informed decisions not to use alcohol or other prohibited substances.
- 2. This project will be under the direct supervision of the Vermont Department of Liquor Control.
- 3. DLC Education Investigator Steven M. Waldo will be the project coordinator. He is also the Vermont representative to the NABCA Education Task Force.

Time Line:

While the grant is being processed, our Education Division will be modifying the content to our Vermont youth needs, while in consultation with our prevention and health experts. The final product will be quickly sent to various vetted printers for price quotes and a suitable printer will be chosen. We will be looking to our community coalitions to assist us in the distribution of the guidebooks throughout the State and anticipate they will be in the hands of our young people by Spring Break time.

Evaluation:

Armed with timely, truthful information, our Vermont youth will be able to correctly choose a healthy path to becoming productive and happy adults by not using alcohol as so many of their classmates seem to do.

Sustainability:

We will be converting the document into a PDF format so it might be placed on our department website for printing by any and all.
