Subject: Grant Request #2749, #2750, #2751, #2752, #2753, #2754, #2755

Enclosed please find seven (7) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration.

JFO #2749 – \$2,928,051 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to the Vermont Department of Public Safety. These funds will be used to provide Federal disaster assistance in response to the December 2014 winter storm affecting Addison, Chittenden, Essex, Franklin, Lamoille, Orange, Orleans, Rutland, Washington and Windsor Counties. [*JFO received 3/24/15*]

JFO #2750 – \$849,360 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to the Vermont Department of Public Safety. These funds will be used for hazard mitigation projects to mitigate future problems identified during May 2013 flooding in Andover, Berlin, Eden, Ludlow, Richmond, Springfield, Weathersfield, West Windsor and Vermont Energy Education Program (VEEP) locations. [*JFO received 3/24/15*]

**JFO** #2751 – \$288,574 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to the Vermont Department of Public Safety. These funds will be used for hazard mitigation projects to mitigate future problems identified during May 2013 flooding in Baltimore, Cabot, Cambridge and Proctor.

**JFO #2752** – \$128,488 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to the Vermont Department of Public Safety. These funds will be used for hazard mitigation projects to mitigate future problems identified during May 2012 flooding in St. Johnsbury. [*JFO received 3/24/15*]

**JFO #2753** – \$155,817 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to the Vermont Department of Public Safety. These funds will be used for hazard mitigation projects to mitigate future problems identified during May 2011 flooding in Rutland City. [*JFO received 3/24/15*]

**JFO** #2754 – \$169,100 grant from the Northern Border Regional Commission (NBRC) to the Agency of Commerce and Community Development (ACCD). These funds will be used to create digital parcel data of towns in the northern border region. This grant was originally awarded to the Vermont Center for Geographic Information (VCGI), which has subsequently sent a request to NBRC to name ACCD as the grantee in anticipation of the transition of VCGI into ACCD.

JFO #2755 – \$9,000 grant from the Sears Consumer Protection Education Fund to the Vermont Attorney General. This grant will be used to fund a three month pilot project to assess the impact of posting a warning advertisement on Google to guide Vermont consumers away from sites offering illegal high-interest loans. [JFO received 3/31/15]

In addition to the above grants, the Administration has also submitted a pre-spending notification (AA-1PN) for \$14,000 that has been spent for filling a limited-service position to perform work in anticipation of a large grant from the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) for the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP). The position is within the Department of Environmental Conservation.

Dear Director Flynn:

Under Section 404 of the Stafford Act, as amended, 75% Federal funding is authorized for hazard mitigation measures. As a condition of receiving Federal disaster assistance, measures must be costeffective, environmentally acceptable and be consistent with the strategies and recommendations identified in your State Hazard Mitigation Plan. Funding for mitigation projects under the HMGP is based on 15% of the estimated aggregate amount of grants made under the Stafford Act. The 12-month final lock-in of \$275,121 in Federal funding is available for the HMGP under FEMA-4120-DR-VT. A breakdown of funding is listed below:

5% PROJECTS	\$ 13,756
7% PROJECTS	\$ 19,258
<b>REGULAR PROJECTS</b>	\$ 242,107
12-MONTH LOCK-IN	\$ 275,121 \$ 288,574
STATE MANAGEMENT COST PROJECTS	\$ 13,453 (4.89%)

This calculation is based on the 12-month estimate as reported by the authorized disaster assistance programs. This is the final 12-month lock-in for FEMA-4120-DR-VT. Final applications or amendments for new mitigation projects must have been submitted to the FEMA Region I Hazard Mitigation Assistance Branch by August 12, 2014.
