Addition to Bird Mountain Wildlife Management Area, Ira, Vermont

Description of Project

The addition of this 130-acre parcel located in the Town of Ira to the Bird Mountain WMA will provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, wildlife viewing, and the conservation of significant wildlife habitat (See Exhibit 1 for a map of the parcel). Bird Mountain Wildlife Management Area (WMA) is a 640-acre parcel of land owned by the State of Vermont and managed by the Vermont Fish & Wildlife Department. The WMA is located approximately six miles west of the city of Rutland. It lies within three towns including 175 acres in Ira, 115 acres in Castleton, and 350 acres in Poultney. The Vermont Fish & Wildlife Department purchased this land in 1976. The WMA's name is derived from the prominent 2,216-foot rock outcrop known as "Birdseye Mountain." A portion of this mountain is publicly owned and occupies the northeast corner of the WMA. The remainder of the mountain is Justin Lindholm's property, the parcel of interest here.

Bird Mountain WMA is situated within the Western Foothills physiographic region, which has one of the mildest climates in the state. The topography of the parcel ranges from fairly level former pasture and farmland to the steep talus slopes of Birdseye Mountain. The mountain overlooks a mix of hardwoods that include red and sugar maple, yellow and paper birch, beech and aspen that covers about 70% of the WMA. The remainder is comprised of white pines and remnant fields. Peregrine falcon nests on the steep rocky ledges of Birdseye Mountain. The historic nesting was one reason for the Department's purchase of this parcel. Now, the nest is actually thought to occur on Justin Lindholm's property.

In addition to supporting the nesting peregrine falcons, Justin Lindholm's property supports a mature example of Red Oak-Northern Hardwood Forest and Transition Hardwood Forest. Both communities, while not uncommon in the state, are in excellent condition with huge red oaks throughout. To find these communities in such good condition is uncommon as the red oak has usually been harvested recently. As such, this property would make an excellent addition to the WMA. Justin has already flagged a road up to a cleared site where a hunting camp or other development could go in. This type of development so close to the falcons and the WMA could infringe on our ability to manage the property over the long-term.

Need and Cost

The Department of Fish and Wildlife is acquiring this parcel to provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, wildlife viewing, other wildlife dependent activities and conservation of significant wildlife habitat including the peregrine falcon nesting site. The estimates set for the total project are \$173,500 which reflects the agreed upon sale price of \$163,500 and the associated costs including the

appraisal, survey, title work and closing costs. Funding for this acquisition will come from Pittman Robertson funds provided to the Department from the U.S. fish and Wildlife Service for the management and development of Wildlife Management Areas. These funds will be matched by the appraised value of the property and the bargain sale price of 75% of that appraisal being provided by the landowner who is interested in having the land conserved and added to the existing Department Bird Mountain Wildlife Management Area. This results in 25% of the appraised value or \$55,500 being donated to the Fish and Wildlife Department.

This project has already been reviewed and approved by the Agency's Land Acquisition Review Committee at their meeting in December, 2008. In addition, Department staff met with the town of Ira on April 6, 2009. The town of Ira unanimously supports the Department purchasing this parcel.




Exhibit 1. Map of proposed land acquisition in Ira.

This project has already been reviewed and approved by the Agency's Land Acquisition Review Committee at their meeting in December, 2008. In addition, Department staff met with the town of Ira on April 6, 2009. The town of Ira unanimously supports the Department purchasing this parcel.




Exhibit 1. Map of proposed land acquisition in Ira.
