JFO #2432 — \$10,000 grant from the American Forest Foundation to the Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation. These funds will be used to enhance the Project Learning Tree (PLT) program by providing funds for training materials, lodging, meals and conference space for training participants. Funds from this grant will be used during fiscal years 2010 and 2011.

Conference Board: \$706,467

Conference Board is a strategic partner in the consortium and provides to the consortium access to a unique resource in the Help Wanted Online database and analytic tools. The budgeted amount is for an 18 month license for seven of the eight states that includes the analytics and a monthly feed of job announcements. New Jersey is not included in the license fee because they are contributing access to the EmployOn database covering their State and potentially two of the other consortium. See leveraged resources for more details.

Georgetown University Center for Education and the Workforce: \$443,488
Georgetown University Center for Education and the Workforce is a
strategic partner in the consortium and will be providing project
management for the entire effort as well as guiding one or more of
the research tasks. The budget allocation is for staff and travel.

Direct Employers Association/NASWA/Job Central National Labor Exchange: \$673,000

The Direct Employers Association/National Association of State Workforce Agencies partnership that is running the National Labor Exchange (NLX) is a strategic partner in the consortium and will coordinate the technology aspects of the project. The funds in the budget include \$35,000 for equipment to host the analysis databases, process the job feeds through the parsing and coding engines, and to host the servers for the Green Jobs Portal and related APIs. There is also funding to cover the costs hosting the equipment and purchasing Internet bandwidth and for engaging programmers and others to development the Portal and other tools. The largest single cost (\$410,000) is for licensing the Burning Glass parsing and analysis engine for an 18-month period for the 8 States in the consortium. Burning Glass has offered to extend the license to other States at a similar discount and to allow States to extend the license to add the sophisticated job matching software for their job banks at a discount.

The involvement of the DEA/NASWA partnership in the consortium is significant because it represents an opportunity to facilitate the replication of the consortium's work. It also makes the platforms and research facilities we are proposing in the grant request potential and logical homes for coordinated national efforts. DEA/NASWA and the consortium welcome that potential.

Administrative costs include 100% of Accountant's, Grant Manager's and Administrative Secretary's wages and fringe, 50% of the travel, \$2,000 in general office supplies, \$3,000 of the publications and communications budgeted amount and \$53,010 of the facilities and overhead costs. Total is: \$214,417 (5.4%).

Leveraged Resources

The consortium's grant would leverage two resources. First, as noted in the budget discussion on the Conference Board, the State of New Jersey will be contributing to the consortium access to the EmployOn database of job openings for analysis. That contribution is worth \$175,000.

The involvement of DEA/NASWA leverages a couple of important resources. First, large green employers can have their jobs added to the overall NLX and to the Green JobCentral at no cost by simply requesting that JobCentral index the jobs directly from their corporate websites. Second, JobCentral is creating and hosting the Green Job Bank at no cost in exchange for the consortium's handling the "green" coding of its job flow.

The proposal as a whole seeks to leverage the "green" investments to add value for all workers whether they are working in the green economy or not. Most of our research efforts will yield value when applied to all occupations and not just "green" ones. For example, the real time demand analysis will be built first to apply to all occupations and then be applied to "green" ones once the definition of "green" is clear. The short term vacancy projections will work the same way covering all occupations and "green" occupations. The tools used to locate "green" skill and knowledge requirements within job announcements can be applied to any job and not just "green" ones providing value to the community colleges and others who need to be able to spot new training requirements quickly.

Item #1: Attached is a copy of the recently approved budget for the grant. The amounts being parceled out to the grant partners are listed under "Contractual;" all other items would be Vermont's share. Item #2: As of right now, the Department has a grand total of 38 positions that are limited service—9 limited service positions in the Unemployment Division funded by ARRA monies, 20 for Workforce Development funded by ARRA monies, 6 positions in Workforce Development funded by the "Disabilities Navigator" Grant, and 3 misclassification investigator positions in Workers' Comp funded by general funds. Prior to this year, only the 6 Disability Navigator positions existed, and grant funding for those will expire on 6/30/2010.

Enclosed please find five (5) requests that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration. These requests include the establishment of six (6) limited service positions and the retention of two existing positions.

JFO #2433 — \$3,999,923 grant from the U.S. Department of Labor to the Vermont Department of Labor. These funds will be used to study the demand for Green Jobs in Vermont and the northeast. Vermont will act as the lead administrative state for this collaboration with Massachusetts, Connecticut, Maine, New York, New Hampshire, and the District of Columbia. Vermont's share of this award is approximately \$530,000. The establishment of two (2) limited service positions are associated with this request, as is the retention of two existing positions. This grant is awarded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act and expedited review of this item has been requested. Joint Fiscal Committee members will be contacted within two weeks with a request to waive the statutory review period and accept this item.

JFO #2434 — \$10,466 grant from the University of Vermont to Agriculture, Food & Markets. These funds will be used to provide oversight of the voluntary Johne's disease program, review risk assessment and management plans, and process invoices for participating veterinarians. [JFO received 3/4/10]

JFO #2435 — \$40,000 donation from the Watershed Center (Bristol, Vermont) to the Department of Fish & Wildlife. This funding represents 25% of the of the purchase price for a conservation easement in the Town of Bristol.

JFO #2436 — \$951,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Labor to the Department of Disabilities, Aging and Independent Living. This grant will be used to further develop a statewide employment-focused Neuro-Resource Facilitation (NRF) System for disabled veterans with Traumatic Brain Injury in Vermont. This grant includes a request for two limited service positions.



3. Justification for this request as an essential grant program need:
The Vermont Department of Labor, along with seven other states in a joint research consortium, was awarded a four-million dollar grant to study the demand for Green Jobs in our state and the North East regional economy. Vermont's share of this award will be approximately \$530,000. Vermont is the lead fiscal administrative state for the project. The research project is designed to work with the state's green related industries to establish a common definition and understanding of what Green industries and jobs are in Vermont and across the region. This will include a common set of job titles as well as the skill sets and training necessary to succeed in these jobs. More importantly, the project seeks to develop and implement a tool that will measure "real time" job demand for Green jobs by tracking all national online job advertising and parsing that database for Green related jobs by state. Once established, the tool will also be able to identify increasing demand for jobs any emerging industry as that growth occurs. Establishing the demand for green jobs will assist job seekers and Vermont's workforce development community in providing for the proper training to ensure success in these careers.



I respectfully request an expedited acceptance review of our attached ARRA-funded Discretionary Grant from the US Department of Labor.




