Enclosed please find seven (7) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration.

JFO #2861 – \$170,000 grant from the Federal Transit Administration to the Agency of Transportation. The funds will be used to establish a training program for Community Health Center staff so that they may act as mobility managers to help transportation-challenged individuals schedule and attend medical appointments. Approximately \$42,500 in State matching funds would be required, which are included in the Agency's FY17 budget. [*JFO received 11/28/16*]

JFO #2862 – \$480,000 grant from Federal Transit Administration to the Agency of Transportation. The grant will be used by the Agency to develop a statewide trip planner to include flexible or demand-driven routes, as well as hail-a-ride and other non-fixed route services , which would be incorporated into mobility applications. Approximately \$120,000 in State matching funds would be required, which are included in the Agency's FY17 budget. [*JFO received 11/28/16*]

JFO #2863 – \$13,000 grant from Vermont Birth to Five to the Agency of Education. The funds will be used to hire temporary staff to process license applications for early childhood educators to meet full-licensing requirements under Act 166. The Agency has experienced an unexpectedly high level of Pre-K applicants and the additional staff would help reduce the backlog and meet Act 166 deadlines.

JFO #2864 – \$30,000 grant from the Trust for Public Land to the Vermont Dept. of Forests, Parks and Recreation. The funds would be used to pay for stewardship planning and improvements to the 2,085 acres that were recently acquired to expand Camel's Hump State Park. The funded activities would include trailhead parking, replacing culverts, developing signage, improving roads and trails, performing natural resource inventories and public involvement events. [*JFO received 11/28/16*]

JFO #2865 – \$15,000 grant from the Vermont Ski Areas Association to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. The funds serve as a donation to support the Working Lands Fund.

The actual grant amount will be between \$15,000 and \$20,000 as stated in the Association's award letter. [*JFO received* 11/28/16]

JFO #2866 – \$10,000 grant from Advocates for Youth to the Agency of Education. The funds would be used to pay for training materials and technical assistance provided to Vermont teachers for the improvement of sexual health education in the State. [*JFO received 11/28/16*]

JFO #2867 – \$100,000 grant from Vermont Technical College (VTC) (as a sub-grant of federal funds) to the Department of Economic Development. The funds will be used to pay for existing staff within the Department to dedicate time to working with employers to identify needed skills in order to create pathways to employment. This sub-grant is part of a \$4 million grant received by VTC from the U.S. Department of Labor under a project titled the *Strengthening Workforce Families Initiative*. The awarded funds will be allocated to the Department in \$25k increments from State FY 2017 through FY 2020. [*JFO received 11/28/16*]

Re: Working Lands Enterprise Fund Donation from Ski Vermont

The Vermont Ski Areas Association ("Ski Vermont") has pledged to contribute the proceeds of their passport program, estimated to total between \$15,000 to \$20,000, to supplement the FY2017 \$594,000 grant budget for the Working Lands Enterprise Program.

These monies will help fund grants to businesses and technical assistance providers. Business grants may be for up to \$50,000, and must display innovation, test a new business model, or address a specific supply chain need. Service Provider grants may be for up to \$75,000 and must demonstrate direct impacts on working lands businesses, including increased sales, job creation or increased output. In the FY2016 grant cycle we received 114 applications for \$3.3 million in funds.

The authorizing statute for the Working Lands Enterprise Program states: "the fund shall be composed of moneys from time to time appropriated to the fund by the general assembly or received from any other source, private or public, approved by the board, and unexpended balances and any earnings shall remain in the fund from year to year."

All funding decisions are made by the WLEB (Working Lands Enterprise Board), which is composed of 20 public, private and non-profit members and chaired by Deputy Secretary LaClair (acting designee for Secretary Ross). Donor will have no input into the decision making process.

Enclosed is the pledge from Ski Vermont outlining the stipulations of their donation and expectations to support the Working Lands Enterprise Initiative.
