





Additional Emphasis on Addison County Businesses

USDA Rural Development received a number of economic distress calls from bankers, business leaders and the Addison County Economic Development Corporation Executive Director at the time of the sudden and unanticipated closure of the Crown Point Bridge. This happened shortly after we had received notice of the \$200,000 Presidential Disaster funding award.

In light of the severe impact on Addison County businesses, we moved immediately to secure authority from our national office to add this region to that of the Northeast Kingdom for emphasis in the allocation of the grant funds. We discussed setting aside \$50,000 for this purpose. The program adjustment was approved via telephone conversations with our DC office.

We have incorporated this provision in our cooperative agreement with the Agency of Commerce. We look forward to your approval of the document as soon as possible. I know we are all anxious to get these funds in the hands of eligible Vermont businesses as they strive to succeed in this challenging economy.






