Subject: Grant Request #2732, #2733, #2734, #2735, #2736

Enclosed please find five (5) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration. Three (3) limited-service positions are associated with these requests.

JFO #2732 – Donation of 20 acres (estimated value: \$54,000) from William Jackson to the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife. The land, located in the town of Starksboro, will become part of the Lewis Creek Wildlife Management Area and will protect public access for hunting, fishing, and wildlife viewing. \$7,500 of federal Pittman-Robertson funding will be used to cover legal costs associated with this acquisition. Expedited review has been requested. Joint Fiscal Committee members will be contacted by December 29th with a request to waive the balance of the review period and accept this donation. JFO #2733 – \$56,000 donation from the Vermont National Guard Charitable Foundation to the Vermont Military Department. These funds will support the maintenance and upkeep of the Vermont National Guard Fallen Heroes Memorial at Camp Johnson in Colchester over a five-year period and will support the purchase of a new Bobcat mower.

JFO #2734 – \$68,000 grant from The Nature Conservancy to the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources, Dept. of Forests, Parks and Recreation. These funds will be used to improve invasive plant management in Vermont through site prioritization and the development of evaluation techniques. This grant will act as a match for existing federal monies from the U.S. Forest Service. **One** (1) **limited-service position**, a Forester I, is associated with this request. [*JFO received* 12/22/14]

JFO #2735 – \$885,072 grant from the U.S. Administration for Children and Families to the Vermont Agency of Human Services, Department for Children and Family. 34% of the funds are through a Behavioral Intervention in Child Support Services (BICS) grant and the remainder from Federal Financial Participation (FFP) matching funds. These funds will be used over three years to test and evaluate proposed behavioral interventions aimed at positively impacting child support collections for Vermont families. The total anticipated grant and match funding will amount to \$1,147,057 and be received over a five-year period.

JFO #2736 – \$663,614 grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used over a three-year period to work with partners around the State to incorporate factors associated with quality-of-life into the State's analysis of health resources and expenditures. **Two (2)** limited-service positions, a Grants Program Manager and a Senior Health Policy Analyst, are associated with this request.

Request for Grant Acceptance Building a Culture of Health in Vermont Summary 12/03/14

The Department of Health has received a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, providing \$663,614 over two years to enable the State to incorporate factors associated with quality of life into the State's analysis of health resources and expenditures.

This funding will allow the State to expand efforts to quantify our investments and track successes to include spending on prevention and health improvement not in current performance and financial data sets. Goals include: (1) evaluate existing performance dashboards and recommend measures to reflect a culture of health and (2) expand the existing health care expenditure analysis to a health expenditure analysis to quantify the State's current investments.

The funds will be used to establish a Grants Program Manager position and a Health Senior Policy Analyst position. Funding will also be used for consultant contracts. Supplies and travel expenditures will also be funded.

The Health Department is hereby seeking approval to receive \$86,144 in new grant funds in State Fiscal Year 2015 and the establishment of two limited service positions. The remainder of the grant funding will be included in the Department's future budget requests. We have attached the grant award document and a copy of the grant application as well as the Position Request Form.

Phase 1: Engage Key Advisors and Stakeholders (Nov 2014 – Jan 2015)

Initiate conversations with key stakeholders within the Agency of Human Services and RWJF to invite participation in an advisory group for this project component to:

- Establish shared understanding of the project, framework of social determinants of health, and vision for using dashboards to reflect progress in creating a culture of health
- Review existing dashboards
- Consider additional metrics for a culture of health framework
- Develop a communication strategy to highlight the multiple contributors to health and the need for shared investment

Phase 2: Conduct Review of Existing Dashboards and Develop Recommendations for Enhancements (Feb 2015 – September 2015)

MILESTONES AND WORK: EXPENDITURE ANALYSIS EXPANSION

11/1/2014 through 10/31/2016

Due to the complexity of the project, the following timeframes are estimates only.

Tier One: Expansion to Include Expenditures through the Agency of Human Services

Phase 1: Establish Framework (Nov 2014 – Jan 2015)

Engage Key Advisors and Stakeholders within the Agency of Human Services to serve on an oversight/advisory group with responsibility to:

- Review existing expenditure analysis and outline the intended expansion
- Define the scope and parameters of an expanded expenditure analysis
- Identify opportunities and barriers to accessing existing data within the Agency
- Understand user needs and data systems regarding both revenues and expenditures within the Agency
- Determine best methods for collecting data
