JFO #2724 – \$489,169 grant from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used to integrate the CDC Vaccine Tracking System (VTrckS) with the Vermont Immunization Registry. Hi Dan:

I'm writing in follow up to your memorandum of November 26, 2014 to the Joint Fiscal Committee regarding JFO # 2724.

JFO #2724 – \$489,169 grant from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used to integrate the CDC Vaccine Tracking System (VTrckS) with the Vermont Immunization Registry. Two (2) limited service positions, one Systems Developer and one Data Repository Manager, are associated with this request. [JFO received 11/21/14]

The Health Department <u>is</u> requesting approval to accept this grant, but we are <u>not</u> requesting the approval of two new limited service positions.

I'm sorry if our request was not clear. We stated in our summary that the grant will be used to support two positions, but we are only asking for approval to accept the new grant award, not to establish two new positions. We didn't include a limited position request form, and our AA-1 didn't reference limited service positions.

The two positions to be funded by the grant exist already. One position (data repository manager) was created via JFO #2689 in August 2014. That request was for positions throughout AHS working on the Integrated Eligibility project. This position will charge time to the IE project and to the VTrckS grant – working on the interface between the immunization registry and the AHS integrated eligibility application master person index.

The other position (system developer) was created via JFO #1951 effective 12/3/2000. It has been funded since then by a succession of immunization program grants. The position is currently authorized through 12/31/2016. This new grant will provide funding to replace a different immunization grant that has ended.

The Department of Health has received a grant from the United States Department of Health & Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, providing \$489,169 over two years, to integrate the CDC Vaccine Tracking System (VTrckS) with the Vermont Immunization Registry.

Request for Grant Acceptance VTrckS Integration Summary 10/17/2014

The Department of Health has received a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, providing \$489,169 over two years, to integrate the CDC Vaccine Tracking System (VTrckS) with the Vermont Immunization Registry. This funding is available through the Prevention and Public Health Fund created by the Affordable Care Act.

Currently, health care providers are required to use VTrckS to place, track and manage vaccines and are required to report vaccinations to the Immunization Registry (IMR). This grant will allow the Department to research, select and implement an inventory management system which will tie these two systems together. A needs assessment will be conducted to assess current state IMR systems for requirements and specifications and review existing vaccine inventory systems and in house development needs. Once a full assessment has been completed, an inventory solution will be selected, developed (if applicable) and implemented. It will be important to choose a solution for which the Vermont Department of Health has the ability to provide the proper support to operate and maintain. Upon implementation of the proposed solution, the system will be tested and piloted and a plan will be developed to transition all enrolled health care providers to use of the IMR for all aspects of vaccine management.

Funds will be used to support two positions, including associated travel and supply costs. The Systems Developer will handle the specific IT tasks entailed in the project, including the review and assessment of system requirements and specifications. The Data Repository Manager will coordinate this project with the larger Shared Public Health Information eXchange (SPHINX) system, via the SPHINX managers group consisting of program representatives from all programs participating in SPHINX. Funds will also be used to cover the costs of a contract to develop and implement a roll-out plan to train health care providers and internal staff.

The Health Department is hereby seeking approval to receive \$100,725 in new Federal funds in State Fiscal Year 2015. The remainder of the Federal funding under this grant will be included in the Department's future budget requests. A copy of the grant application and award document are included for your information.
