Enclosed please find one (1) item, which the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the Administration. The Agency of Natural Resources has requested an expedited review of JFO #3263. Please respond by Thursday, October 2, 2025, by 9AM.

JFO #3263: Bargain sale of 176 acres in Addison, Vermont to expand the Dead Creek Wildlife Management area, to the Agency of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife. The parcel is valued at \$755,000.00. Bargain sale price is \$700,000.00 (\$55,000.00 donation) as well as a \$50,000.00 grant from Ducks Unlimited, bringing the total donation/grant to \$105,000.00. A portion of the purchase price will come from a long-standing and recurring grant, previously approved, from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The remainder of the funds will come from the Vermont Housing and Conservation Board and the Department of Fish and Wildlife's Duck Stamp program (breakdown included in the AA-1).



Enclosed is an approval request memo for Governor Scott's review authorizing the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) to acquire a 176-acre parcel of land in the town of Addison to expand to the existing Dead Creek Wildlife Management Area (WMA). This project involves the acquisition, in fee, of one parcel as a subdivision from a larger farm property.

The parcel is being acquired with funds from the US EPA, the Vermont Housing and Conservation Board (VHCB), DFW's Duck Stamp program, and a one-time grant from Ducks Unlimited (DU). The acquisition features a negotiated bargain sale gift of \$55,000 as well as a new funding grant from DU for the acquisition and associated costs. DFW is seeking approval to acquire the property under 10 V.S.A. §4144 for the acquisition of the property and 10 V.S.A. § 4147 for the conveyance of the conservation easement to the VHCB.

Background:

The DFW is seeking to acquire 176 acres on Gage Road in Addison, to expand the existing Dead Creek Wildlife Management Area which is currently a nearly 3,000-acre tract in the towns of Addison, Panton, and Ferrisburgh. The subject parcel is currently owned by Suseanne Goulet, who resides in a home on the property. Suseanne and her late brother, Paul, have lived and worked on the Gage Road property since they took over the farm in the 1980s. Having recently settled her brother's estate, Ms. Goulet is now planning for the future of the property. She is conservation minded and has agreed to sell the majority of the parcel to VDFW while retaining 27 acres after a subdivision.

Property Descriptions and Ecological Features:

The Goulet Farm is an ideal parcel for acquisition and wetland restoration as there are not many large, state-land-abutting, un-conserved farms remaining in the Lake Champlain Basin.

Close to 80% of the parcel is mapped as hydric soils with high wetland restoration potential. DFW is bringing multiple funding sources to this project to create a variety of habitat and restoration outcomes. This acquisition and future restoration will enhance water quality in the Lake Champlain Basin and provide vital habitat for wetland-dependent wildlife and Vermont's state-threatened grassland birds. Two different wetland restoration outcomes are envisioned for the property; funding sources will be pro-rated across the acreage for these outcomes. DFW intends to establish open wetland and grassland habitats in the property's northern area to benefit migratory waterfowl and grassland birds. DFW will work with farmers in the community to rotate hay and row crops to accomplish these outcomes. On the southern portion of the property DFW plans to plug ditches and extend the existing Clayplain Forest from west to east to create forested wetlands where the agricultural drainages current carry water an nutrients off the property into Dead Creek.

The parcel includes small headwater streams to Dead Creek, state-significant examples of Mesic Clayplain Forest, and currently supports habitat for Grasshopper Sparrow (Very Rare), Northern Harrier Hawks and Wandering Glider Dragonfly (both Uncommon). The property contains Vermont Conservation Design Highest Priority Geologic, Riparian Connectivity, and Surface Water components as well as Priority Interior Forest components.

There are currently no VAST, ATV, or biking trails on this property which would be disrupted by this acquisition. Because of the wetland restoration planned for the site DFW has no plans to create new hiking or biking trails at this time.

Proposed Acquisition

The property was appraised at a fair market value of \$755,000, DFW and the seller negotiated to a purchase price of \$700,000 (essentially offering the DFW a \$55,000 gift). Additionally, DFW secured a grant from Ducks Unlimited for \$50,000 for this acquisition. Approval for this grant and gift will be submitted separately. DFW is seeking approval to acquire the property under 10 V.S.A. §4144.

DFW has also secured funding from the VHCB for \$385,000, all of which will go towards the purchase price. In consideration for the VHCB funding DFW will grant VHCB an easement for the development rights, conservation restrictions, and public access in perpetuity. DFW is seeking approval to convey this easement to the VHCB under 10 V.S.A. § 4147.

Additional funding sources include DFW's US EPA wetland restoration and acquisition grant and VDFW's Duck Stamp Fund. The former will be applied primarily to the purchase price, the latter primarily toward associated costs.

The town of Addison reviewed and discussed this proposed acquisition at its 2/4/2025 Selectboard meeting. The Selectboard voted to remain neutral and not oppose the sale to the state. PILOT payments to Addison are estimated at \$979 annually beginning in 2026. PILOT payments on DFW parcels are paid with a combination of general fund dollars and funding from the US Fish and Wildlife Service. Continued maintenance and management of the property will come from

DFW's existing US Fish and Wildlife Service Habitat Grant and its EPA Wetland Restoration Grant.

Your approval requested for the acquisition of the property pursuant to 10 V.S.A. §4144 which states in part, "The Secretary, with approval of the Governor, may acquire for the use of the Department of Fish and Wildlife by gift, purchase, or lease, any and all rights and interests in lands, ponds and streams..." Your approval is also requested for the conveyance of the conservation easement to the VHCB pursuant to 10 V.S.A. § 4147 which states in part, "...[T]he Secretary with the approval of the Governor may convey, exchange, sell or lease lands of the Department of Fish and Wildlife for... implementing the acquisition of new lands for

conservation and recreation..."
