NELLIE MAE EDUCATION FOUNDATION GRANT AGREEMENT FORM

On July 20, 2016 the Nellie Mae Education Foundation (Grantor) granted to the Vermont Agency of Education (Grantee), the amount of \$7,500 payable for Supporting VT Leaders on Atlantic Rim trip. Grantee agrees and consents to the following conditions of the grant:

- 1. Grantee will use the grant solely for the purposes stated in the accompanying cover letter, and Grantee will repay to Grantor any portion of the grant which has not been expended within the time period specified in the grant proposal.
- 2. Grantee will submit a final report to the Grantor when the work is completed. The report may be a brief email (1-3 paragraphs) that describes how the funds are/were used and/or any materials that have been created to document the work. The report should also indicate how much of the grant has been spent. The remaining 20% of the grant will be disbursed upon review and receipt of the report and/or materials. Reports should be emailed to Charlie Toulmin at ctoulmin@nmefoundation.org
- 3. Grantee will advise the Foundation immediately if the federal government, IRS, or state or local authorities gives the Grantee notice of a change in its tax status.
- 4. Grantee shall not use any portion of the funds granted herein to carry on lobbying or otherwise to attempt to influence specific legislation, either by direct or grassroots lobbying, nor to carry on directly or indirectly a voter registration drive, nor to make grants to individuals on a non-objective basis, nor to use the funds for any noncharitable or non-educational purpose.
- 5. Grantee will secure for any participant who, at the time of participation, is under the age of 18 a parental consent form signed by the participant's parents or legal guardians, describing in adequate detail the nature, circumstances and duration of the minor's participation and authorizing the participant's participation.
- 6. If the grant is \$25,000 or greater, the grantee shall contact the communications department of the Nellie Mae Education Foundation before any media outreach/communication surrounding the awarding of the grant. The grantee will coordinate with Chiara Wegener, Communications Associate in order to develop an outreach strategy that serves the needs of both organizations. - 7. Grantee acknowledges that the funds provided by the Grantor are significant to the operations of the project, program or initiative named in the cover letter accompanying this Agreement. Grantee acknowledges it is able to be attentive to the operations of the Grantor through the signing of this Grant Agreement Form, the development of a Memorandum of Understanding, the submission of regular progress reports, and/or its on-going relationship with the program cluster and initiative.

Dear Rebecca.

I am delighted to attach the formal invitation to participate in the Atlantic Rim Collaboratory in September in Iceland. You were one of the very first to show enthusiasm for this idea and I am thrilled to invite you formally as this becomes a reality. The invitation is self explanatory in most respects. It might be helpful to add a couple of points here.

As you know, the idea of this Summit has been under discussion with several governments for more than a year- all by personal contact and communication. For instance, with my partners at Conexus, I met with state officials in Sweden a week last Friday. Based on many conversations we have had with large systems in the past two years, we have come to believe there is a real need to shift and expand the narrative of educational change globally to include the values and directions within the invitation. Vermont will be an extraordinarily good fit for this group and was the very first state we approached (and the only one of two) and it will be able to help move the world of education in a bold yet specific new direction. In the current climate of ESSA, we hope it will also help Vermont lead other states in a humanistic, equitable and professionally run direction.

Formal invitations were sent on Friday to Norway and Sweden. Today, the remaining invitations are sent to Ontario, California and Scotland. Iceland are included as the hosts of course. Once the replies have been received from this first wave, we will then invite a second smaller group to join us. It would be very helpful if you can respond formally in the next few days.

Our job is to make this summit happen and bring people together with top thought leaders (including Pasi Sahlberg) and a world class facilitator. The group may and should then set its own direction within the broad terms of the initial value statement. This may include the actions listed in the letter, system peer-reviews, thematic reviews of areas like boys' achievement, math education etc, developing indicators, making a declaration of purpose - even changing the name!!

I would personally be honored if Vermont would join us. The world will turn even more towards your state and system as you do so, but more importantly it is with your leadership and participation that we can also help turn the world.

By the time you get this letter we will have met at HGSE.

The first summit will be hosted in Iceland, at the Hilton Reykjavik Hotel, September 14 and 15, 2016. There is an additional opportunity to visit Icelandic educational and cultural institutions on September 13th. The purpose of the summit is to:

- Co-create new narratives of high-quality education.
- Define or redefine the vision for the Collaboratory.
- Co-create a realistic strategy to achieve it.
- Commit to achieving implementation and outcomes over at least 3 years.

The Collaboratory will build on current strengths and strategies of your own and other educational systems with the intention of improving them over time through deliberately designed processes. It will seek out and spread current best practices, and develop next practices that reflect Atlantic Rim values, alongside existing OECD and UN initiatives. The Collaboratory will also develop collective responsibility for shared success and global impact.

This group will energize member systems with agendas determined by themselves; stimulate discourse by providing high level contact with world thought leaders; widen and deepen the global narrative of educational change; and lead to clear, collectively determined outcomes, such as:

- A common declaration initiating a new global direction for education
- Development of broad indicators in line with Atlantic Rim values
- Peer-review and critical friendships among the participating systems
- Thematic reviews on urgent topics decided by the participants, e.g. boys' achievement, mathematics performance, education of refugees.

Here educational ministers and staff will discuss education and education policy together with influential educational thinkers. The detailed agenda will be developed in cooperation with the founding systems.

The ARC-summit will honour the 30th anniversary of the meeting between President Reagan and President Gorbachev in Iceland in 1986. In the 1986 meeting Gorbachev was asked to "tear down this wall". One of the founding ideas behind Atlantic Rim is to tear down the walls between countries and regions, as well as between educational researchers and politicians, to pursue the most fundamental ideas of what it means to be educated in today's world for the mutual benefit of all ARC-systems and future generations of students worldwide.
