8. Purpose of Grant:

The project will update the National Wetlands Inventory mapping for a portion of the Lamoille River Watershed to improve state knowledge of the location and condition of these wetlands for management purposes. The project will develop new methodologies and refine existing approaches to gain a better understanding of how best to incorporate automated products into wetland spatial data creation which could lead to greater efficiencies in improving wetland mapping.

9. Impact on existing program if grant is not Accepted:

The goal of the Watershed Management Welands Program is to identify and protect significant wetlands and their functions and values provided to the public. The State of Vermont has the opportunity to be a leaders in the field of automated wetland mapping. The Wetlands Program has worked diligently to update wetland mapping in Vermont and does not have funding to complete mapping for the state. This contribution will bring us closer to the goal of having updated mapping that is equitable throughout the state. If this grant is not accepted, a statewide update of wetland mapping may not be accomplished. Less wetland mapping means less clairty for the regulated public for siting projects, and reduces the effectivness of water quality improvement projects.

SCOPE OF WORK

1. Project Description

The Service hereby incorporates the recipient's application submitted to and approved by the Service into these award terms and conditions.

The Vermont wetland mapping pilot project will result in new digital NWI standard compliant data for 4 HUC12's located along the Lamoille River corridor comprising: Brewster River-Lamoille River, Gihon River, North Branch LaMoille River, and Seymour River-Lamoille River watersheds with a collective area totaling approximately 149,282 acres. A comprehensive assessment and review of the resulting wetland spatial data, in addition to the processes and methodologies used throughout the life of the project will be performed by the Vermont Wetlands and the NWI Programs. In addition, the resultant methods will be evaluated for potential larger landscape applications to determine the viability of using this approach for future wetland updates.
