At the December 19, 2008 meeting of the Joint Fiscal Committee, the following grant requests were approved:

JFO #2352 — \$807,500 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to the Vermont Agency of Human Services - Department of Health.

JFO #2353 — \$9,000 grant from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to the Agency of Natural Resource – Environmental Conservation.

JFO #2354 — \$161,407 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Department of Corrections.

JFO #2355 — \$20,000 grant from the State Justice Institute to the Judiciary – Vermont Supreme Court.

JFO #2356 — \$333,002 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Judiciary – Court Administrator's Office.

JFO #2357 — \$212,408 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Judiciary – Court Administrator's Office.

JFO #2360 — \$2,000,000 grant from Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration to the Agency of Human Services – Department of Mental Health.

JFO #2361 — \$21,000 grant from the State Justice Institute to the Judiciary.

JFO #2362 — \$32,125 grant from the U.S. Department of Education to the Vermont Department of Education.

JFO #2363 — \$166,160 grant from the Center for Applied and Special Technology to the Vermont Department of Education.

JFO #2364 — \$12,000 grant from the National Governor's Association to the Agency of Human Services – Department of Children and Families. This grant was approved with the understanding that expenditure of the \$9,885 in state funds, as originally proposed, was no longer considered necessary and would not occur.

JFO #2365 — \$19,140 donation from the Vermont Veterinary Medical Association (VVMA) to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets.

JFO #2366 — \$500,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to the Agency of Transportation – Department of Motor Vehicles.

In accordance with 32 V.S.A. §5, these grants were placed on the Joint Fiscal Committee agenda and subsequently approved by vote of the Committee. We ask that you inform the Secretary of Administration and your staff of this action.

Enclosed please find three (3) requests which the Joint Fiscal Office recently received from the Administration:

JFO #2355 — \$20,000 grant from the State Justice Institute to the Judiciary – Vermont Supreme Court. These grant funds will be used to fund scholarships for out of state training and education of trial court judges. [*JFO received 12/04/08*]

JFO #2356 — \$333,002 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) to the Judiciary – Court Administrator's Office. These grant funds will be used to fund enhancements to the treatment courts by supporting coordination, case management, and other activities. Some funding will also be used to support local efforts to explore alternatives to the criminal justice system. [*JFO received 12/04/08*]

JFO #2357 — \$212,408 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) to the Judiciary – Court Administrator's Office. These grant funds will be used to partially fund the Judiciary's new case management system. [*JFO received 12/04/08*]



The Vermont Supreme Court, through its Office of the Court Administrator, submits this curriculum adaptation and training (CAT) grant proposal to support the out-of-state education of judicial officers.

Project Des cription

The Vermont Judiciary has traditionally sought SJI scholarships to support out of state education for new judges and for experienced judges who are rotating into a new court with responsibility for dockets in which they have little or no experience, or have not sat in some time.

If, in addition to these ongoing scholarship opportunities, we were awarded a CAT grant, we would focus these additional monies in the following areas.

1. Core Programs for Experienced Judges

For judges who are not new to the bench, our approach to out of state education (in most instances) has been rather reactive. Judges express interest in attending a particular program and decisions are made based on whether grant or scholarship funds are available.

(802)828-4766 elizabéth.finn@state.vt.us If we were not dependent on grant or scholarship funds, we would offer a core group of programs from which these more seasoned judges could select. The current SJI scholarship guidelines restrict attendance to no more than 1 program every 2 years. With additional funding, we could offer judges the opportunity to attend programs more frequently.

These "core" programs would include

- ✤ Judicial Writing and/or Logic and Opinion Writing
- Managing Complex Litigation
- Effective Caseflow Management
- ✤ Advanced Evidence
- Enhancing Judicial Bench Skills
- Best Practices in Handling Cases with Self-Represented Litigants
- Building a Bias-Free Environment in the Court

Topic Specific Courses

We face a similar situation in terms of our ability to send judges to out of state courses that are topic specific. Although we have been very fortunate to have grant funds which support education in the areas of domestic violence and juvenile justice, our ability to send judges to other topic specific courses is extremely limited.

The Vermont bench is not large (we have approximately 40 trial court judges) and it is difficult for us to develop our own internal programs on these topics. There are simply not enough judges requiring education on the same topic at the same time. If awarded a CAT grant, we would offer opportunities to attend courses relating to topic specific areas such as Co-Occurring Mental and Substance Abuse Disorders and 4th Amendment Comprehensive Search and Seizure training.

In summary, although we would continue to apply for SJI scholarships for our new judges and for more experienced judges who are assuming new docket responsibilities, a CAT grant would help us put in place a more structured program for judges at the "mid-level" point of their career.

How would the grant funds be used?

The total cost for the project as proposed will be \$22,000 including SJI funds and cash match. An additional \$8,000 will be provided through an in-kind match.

This \$22,000 would enable us to support 10-15 courses, including the cost of tuition, airfare, lodging and meals. The actual number would be dependent on the location of the program and the associated costs.

To meet the \$8,000 in-kind contribution, we would document the time judicial officers spent attending and/or traveling to out of state educational programs as well as the time that administrative staff spend making registration, hotel and travel arrangements and preparing grant reports.

Elizabeth Finn will provide staff support and assist the judges with their registration and travel arrangements.

The CAO will submit quarterly progress and financial reports in accord with the requirements of the State Justice Institute. At the conclusion of the project, the CAO will submit a final report which includes evaluations of programs supported by the grant.
