Enclosed please find seven (7) requests that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration. These requests include the establishment of three (3) limited service positions and the retention of two existing positions.

JFO #2439 — \$410,215 grant from the USDA Food and Nutrition Service to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will support Women, Infants Children program improvement projects in the areas of cash value benefit cards and replacement of the legacy computer system. The establishment of one (1) limited service position is associated with this request. This grant is awarded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

JFO #2440 — \$6,647 grant from the University of Vermont to Agriculture, Food & Markets. These funds will be used to support the Farm First program in providing dairy producers and their families with counseling, resources, and referral information related to stress and other concerns. [JFO received 3/29/10]

JFO #2441 — \$700,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Vermont Department of Children and Families. This grant will be used to fund 12 sub-awards to schools and non-profits targeting youth delinquency prevention.

JFO #2442 — \$807,454 grant from the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used to support efforts to reduce tobacco use and expand tobacco cessation quit lines. This grant is awarded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

[JFO received 4/06/10]

JFO #2443 — \$5,034,328 grant from the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services to the Office of Vermont Health Access. This grant will be used to establish a statewide health information exchange (HIE) network and interstate HIE interoperability. The establishment of one (1) limited service position is associated with this request. MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT between the Wildlife Management Institute and Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation

A Cooperative Habitat Project under the Northern Forest Woodcock Initiative

Wildlife Management Institute (WMI), a private, nonprofit, scientific and educational organization committed to the conservation, enhancement and professional management of North America's wildlife and other natural resources; and Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation (VDFPR), 103 South Main Street, 10 South, Waterbury, VT 05671 hereinafter referred to as the Landowner, have agreed to the following initiatives on the property of the Landowner located at Groton State Forest in the towns of Groton and Peacham, Caledonia County, Vermont to benefit the American woodcock and other "Species of Greatest Conservation Need".

BASIS for NORTHERN FOREST WOODCOCK INITIATIVE-

- State Wildlife Action Plans in BCR 14 list 57 "Species of Greatest Conservation Need" that require young forest and shrubland habitats.
- The states of Maine, Vermont, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut and New York have declared American woodcock to be a species of greatest conservation need within their respective Wildlife Action Plans
- American woodcock populations have declined 2 to 4 percent per year since the early 1970s.
- Research has documented that the loss of young forest and shrubland habitats is the primary cause of the decline.
- Habitats used by woodcock also support other high priority species in need of conservation action.

- The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has named American woodcock as one of eight national focus species.
- Partners In Flight and the North American Bird Conservation Initiative has ranked woodcock as a highest (global) priority species in need of conservation action.

DECLARATION-

Now therefore, the signing of this Agreement by both parties signifies that the WMI and the Landowner understand the importance of early succession forest habitats and are committed to initiating practices to benefit the American woodcock and other young forest/shrubland wildlife species in decline.

THE AGREEMENT-

The Wildlife Management Institute and VDFPR agree to the following:

- 1. WMI agrees that all site specific documents, materials, and conversations between the Landowner and WMI are proprietary and as such are owned and controlled by the Landowner in this agreement.
- 2. The Landowner agrees to provide the WMI with accurate and timely documentation of activities conducted by the Landowner as required by conditions of the grant.
- 3. The total value of this grant for non-commercial early successional habitat management activities outlined in Attachment A shall not exceed \$10,000.
- 4. Project management prescriptions, special instructions, implementation schedules, report requirements, maps/aerial photos, budgets, source of funds, and payment procedures agreed to by the WMI and the Landowner will be included and itemized, as needed, in Attachment A and attached to this agreement.
- 5. The Landowner agrees to allow WMI (or a designated agent of WMI) to have ingress and egress access to their property to review, plan and/or implement conservation practices as agreed upon by WMI and the Landowner (Attachment A).
- 6. Landowner guarantees ownership of the above-described property and warrant that there are no outstanding rights or claims (pending or threatened), to the best of its knowledge, that might interfere with this Agreement.

TERM-

This agreement will be for 2 years beginning January 1, 2010, and ending December 31, 2011. This agreement may be modified or terminated at any time by mutual consent of the parties or be terminated by any party upon 30 days written notice to the other.

ATTACHMENT A

SCOPE OF SEVICES:

I. Vermont Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation Responsibilities

- 1. Through gravel pit reclamation, create a roost field for American woodcock that is approximately 5 acres or larger in size (refer to www.timberdoodle.org for guidelines).
 - a. The vegetative structure of roosting habitats should be sparse enough for woodcock to detect ground predators while affording scattered overhead protection from avian predators. Characteristics of a roost fields include:
 - i. A site that is relatively barren with light herbaceous ground cover,
 - ii. Patches of bare ground,
 - iii. Occasional weed/shrub cover for overhead protection,
 - iv. Clump grasses are preferred over sod grasses, and
 - v. Scattered small shrubs and trees <4 feet in height.
 - b. Sites should be maintained in this condition through mowing, controlled burning, or herbicides.
 - c. Allow, if possible, a 100 foot border of the 5 acres opening to regenerate into dense sapling sized deciduous shrubs and trees for woodcock nesting habitat.
- 2. With remaining funds, use appropriate equipment to mow log landings and major skid trails to develop and/or maintain woodcock singing grounds at sites adjacent to or near woodcock nesting habitats.
- 3. VDFPR shall submit itemized invoices to:

4. In the performance of this Agreement, VDFPR and their contractors shall comply with sound environmental practices in implementing the provisions of this Agreement including, but not limited to, all federal and state environmental laws and regulations that may relate to wetlands, forestry and gravel pit reclamation. WMI shall not be liable for any costs associated with corrective measures taken to repair or remediate damages to the project area as a result of work performed under this Agreement.

II. WMI Responsibilities

1. For work completed in accordance with this Agreement, WMI will pay VDFPR based on invoices submitted by VDFPR. The invoice or correspondence will be mailed to the above-mentioned WMI representative.

2. WMI payments shall not exceed \$10,000.
