Enclosed please find one (1) item that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration.

JFO #2860 – \$217,890 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to the Department of Public Safety. These funds were granted to the Department in CY 2014 but the grant did not go through the grant approval procedures, and therefore was never formally approved by the Joint Fiscal Committee. To date, most funding from the award has been spent, however, the Department has been notified by FEMA that it will receive additional funding to be spent in State FY 2017 and 2018. The funds have been, and would continue to be, used to purchase safety and rescue equipment for firefighters.

The Department is requesting retroactive approval of the grant from 2014. A memo from Secretary of Administration Trey Martin is included in the grant materials acknowledging that proper procedures were not followed when the grant was originally awarded and stating that actions have been taken to ensure that the error does not happen again. Upon receiving approval of the 2014 grant, the Department would be free to accept the new grant at its discretion as an ongoing funding source, per current grant approval procedures. [*JFO received 11/16/16*]

Please find attached an AA-1 for your approval. In August of 2014 the Vermont Department of Public Safety (DPS) was awarded a federal Assistance to Firefighters grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This federal grant award of \$217,890 is for the purpose of protecting the public and firefighters from fire and fire-related hazards through the purchase of safety and rescue equipment. This grant included a required state share based on size of population served, which amounted to \$24,210, or roughly an 11% match.

Upon receipt of the Form AA-1, Finance and Management was notified by the Commissioner of Public Safety that the Assistance to Firefighters grant had not followed applicable state policy and procedures in regards to grant acceptance. The grant had been awarded in 2014, however was never submitted for approval to the Joint Fiscal Committee. Thus, purchases of equipment have already occurred and if grant approval were denied the costs would need to be covered by the General Fund.

Both Finance and Management and the Secretary of Administration office have spoken with the Dept. of Public Safety to ensure this error does not occur in the future.

Vehicle Awards

Article I - Administrative Requirements

The administrative requirements that apply to most DHS award recipients through a grant or cooperative agreement arise from two sources: - Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-102, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments (also known as the "A-102 Common Rule"), found under FEMA regulations at Title 44, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 13, "Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments." - OMB Circular A-110, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Non-Profit Organizations, relocated to 2 CFR Part 215. The requirements for allowable costs/cost principles are contained in the A-102 Common Rule, OMB Circular A-110 (2 CFR § 215.27), DHS program legislation, Federal awarding agency regulations, and the terms and conditions of the award. The four costs principles circulars are as follows: - OMB Circular A-21, Cost Principles for Educational Institutions, relocated to 2 CFR Part 220. - OMB Circular A-87, Cost Principles for State, Local, and Indian Tribal Governments, relocated to 2 CFR Part 225. - OMB Circular A-122, Cost Principles for Non-Profit Organizations, relocated to 2 CFR Part 230. - OMB Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations.

Environmental Planning and Historic Preservation Screening

Article II - Lobbying Prohibitions

None of the funds provided under an award may be expended by the recipient to pay any person to influence, or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with any Federal action concerning the award or renewal of any Federal contract, grant, loan, cooperative agreement. These lobbying prohibitions can be found at 31 U.S.C. § 1352.

Article III - Financial Reporting

Recipients will be required to submit a semi-annual Federal Financial Report (FFR), Standard Form (SF-425) through the AFG online e-grant system. The FFR is intended to provide Federal agencies and grant recipients with a standard format and consistent reporting requirements throughout the government. The FFR is due semi-annually based on the calendar year beginning with the period after the award is made. Recipients are required to submit an FFR throughout the entire period of performance of the grant. The reporting periods for the FFR are January 1 through June 30 (report due by July 31), and July 1 through December 31 (report due by January 31). At the end of the grant's period of performance, all recipients are required to produce a final report on how the grant funding was used and the benefits realized from the award. Recipients must submit a final financial report and a final performance report within 90 days after the end of the period of performance.

Article IV - GPD - Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000

All recipients of financial assistance will comply with the requirements of the government-wide award term which implements Section 106(g) of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA) of 2000, as amended (22 U.S.C. § 7104), located at 2 CFR Part 175. This is implemented in accordance with OMB Interim Final Guidance, Federal Register, Volume 72, No. 218, November 13, 2007. In accordance with the statutory requirement, in each agency award under which funding is provided to a private entity, Section 106(g) of the TVPA, as amended, requires the agency to include a condition that authorizes the agency to terminate the award, without penalty, if the recipient or a sub-recipient - (a) Engages in severe forms of trafficking in persons during the period of time that the award is in effect; (b) Procures a commercial sex act during the period of time that the award is in effect; or (c) Uses forced labor in the performance of the award or subawards under the award. Full text of the award term is provided at 2 CFR § 175.15.

Article V - GPD - Drug-Free Workplace Regulations

All recipients of financial assistance will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 (41 U.S.C. §701 et seq.), which requires that all organizations receiving grants from any Federal agency agree to maintain a drug-free workplace. The recipient must notify the awarding office if an employee of the recipient is convicted of violating a criminal drug statute. Failure to comply with these requirements may be cause for debarment. Per our conversation earlier today regarding the Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) (CFDA 97.044), I wanted to clarify that Public Safety received AFG grants first for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2013. We also received an AFG award for FFY 2015 and are just now applying for the FFY16 award. I'm not sure how this was missed, but I was not able to verify that the spending under this grant program was included in our listing of federal awards in our budget submissions so I don't believe your argument that this was approved in the overall approval of the budget would be an accurate statement.

FYI, spending of the FFY13 award funding for which we are seeking the AA.1 approval is just now being completed and closed out. We will likely be expending the FFY15 award in late FFY17 into FFY18 as this award is being used to partially fund a construction project at the VT Fire Academy.
