By acceptance of awards for this program, the grantee agrees to comply with the requirements included in both the General and Supplemental Terms and Conditions for this program.

The administration of this program is subject to: (1) the statutory requirements of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) (Public Law 116-136) and (2) the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act, 42 U.S.C. § 10401 *et seq."

In order to receive FVPSA CARES Act funding, FVPSA state administrators, tribes, and state domestic violence coalitions must submit a brief statement within 30 days of receiving funding. This statement must verify that the agency, tribe, or coalition is in a position to: (1) use these funds to conduct human service activities related to or affected by COVID-19 for services and supports for victims of domestic violence and their dependents; and (2) accept a supplemental award and the terms and conditions for the allowable use of funds; which includes issuing supplemental awards.

The program is codified at 42 U.S.C. §§10406, 10408, 10409 and the program-specific implementing regulations are located at 45 CFR Part 1370. As applicable to insular areas identified under 45 CFR § 97 11, all of 45 CFR Part 97 – Consolidation of Grants applies to this program. The Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for IIIIS Awards is located under 45 CFR Part 75. In accordance with 45 CFR §75.101 Applicability, this program must comply with 45 CFR Part 75 in its entirety. No exceptions are identified.

Additional applicable regulations and requirements can be found in the General Terms and Conditions for Mandatory: Formula, Block and Entitlement Grants,

This program has no cost sharing, matching or Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement per the CARES Act which provides these funds "without regard to matching requirements under section 306(c)(4) [42 U.S.C. §10406(c)(4)]."

Federal funds shall be used to supplement not supplant other Federal. State, tribal, and local public funds expended to provide services and activities that promote the objectives of this program. See 42 U.S.C. §10406(c)(6).

Federal funds awarded under this grant must be expended for the purposes which they were awarded and within the time period allotted.

States only. This program has an Administrative Cost requirement. According to 42 U.S.C. §10406(b)(1), each State may not use more than 5 percent of grant funds for State administrative costs.

The OMB approved Financial Reporting form for this program is the Financial Status Report SF-425. The SF-425 is due annually and no later than December 30 which is 90 days after the end of each project period, SF-425 must be submitted through the Payment Management System (PMS) at the Program Support Center (PSC).

Obligation/Liquidation Deadline: CARES Act funds must be obligated by September 30, 2021, and liquidated by December 30, 2021. Any Federal funds from this award not obligated or liquidated by the deadlines cited above will be recouped by ACF.

These funds can be used restore amounts, either directly or through reimbursement, for obligations incurred to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus, domestically or internationally, from January 20, 2020, and prior to the effective date of the Federal award.

FVPSA CARES Act supplemental grant recipients are required to submit post award documents related to the funding. Post-award documents consist of supplemental funding verification statement, a use of funds narratives. SF 424-A budget forms, budget narrative, performance progress reports and financial reports.

Insular Areas, Territories that consolidate FVPSA CARES funds with other HHS funds, per 45 CFR Part 97, are not required to submit the annual FVPSA performance progress reports and programmatic assurances. However, if FVPSA CARES funds are not consolidated, the reports are required for these antities.

PERSONNEL NARRATIVE: FVPSA Covid Funds will help to provide critical advocacy services during a time of increased danger for survivors of domestic violence and for Vermont's domestic violence organizations. At Aware, Tonda Bryant will work 11 hours each week on COVID related activities. She is AWARE's Youth Advocate and Community Strategist and works directly with survivors of domestic and sexual violence as well as provides support and education to local professionals and community members. Carrie Harvey is the Youth and Family Services Coordinator at Circle. She is responsible for developing and implementing programming at the emergency shelter for youth and families. FVPSA COVID funds will support 5.7 hours a week of her time specifically for the increased COVID-19 challenges in providing criminal court advocacy services for survivors of domestic violence. For Steps to End Domestic Violence the FVPSA Covid Funds were allocated to allow Steps to hire a Housing Coordinator sooner than anticipated. Since the pandemic happened, there has been a significant increase in the need for emergency housing and the current caseload at STEPS has tripled. This requires more housing resource navigation as well as personal advocacy for housing. The Executive Director at Umbrella manages Advocacy program directors in Newport and St. Johnsbury and provides leadership on new COVID-related programming and spending. At WomenSafe the Executive Director has been working daily on updating policies, procedures and protocols for COVID-19, the Admin Coordinator at WomenSafe assists with the implementation of those changes. The 5% Admin for Center for Crime Victim Services will be used for generating award documents, processing financial payments to subgrantees, monitoring, reporting and oversight of the grants and a portion of that 5% will go to the salaries of the Grants Manager and Finace Director at the Center for Crime Victim Services.

The remaining benefits of Medical Workers Compensation are covered by Circle and other funding sources; 30% of the benefits portion for Clarina's Beth Reagle, and 20% of Amanda Cochrane's at Umbrella. At WomenSafe FVPSA Covid Funds will cover 25% and 15% of Carol Rule's and Kerri Duquette Hoffman's apportioned benefits. The 5% Admin for Center for Crime Victim Services will be used for generating award documents, processing financial payments to subgrantees, monitoring, reporting and oversight of the grants and a portion of that 5% will go to the benefits of the Grants Manager and Finace Director at the Center for Crime Vicitm Services.

SUPPLIES NARRATIVE: The NewStory Legal Advocate did not have home internet service prior to COVID-19. In order to support clients remotely and participate in mandatory meetings, NewStory agreed to pay for the connection of wi-fi and 60% of the monthly cost through August. Vonage VOIP phones allow all NewStory Staff to answer office phones from their home or cell phone in real time with no need for survivors to wait on hold or leave a message. Hand sanitizer is used by staff, shelter residents, and distributed to service users. Computer monitor privacy screen will be used on the computer located in a more public area of the building. Disinfecting cleaning supplies are used in both the shelter and office space. PPE is supplied to staff, shelter residents, and service users. Thermometers are used to monitor staff, shelter residents, and walk-in service users. Laptop computers will allow New Story to eliminate shared work spaces in order to meet social distancing guidelines for COVID-19. Wireless outdoor camera system will allow us to provide better security around the outside perimeter of shelter. Wi-fi range extender was needed in order for a member of the NewStory advocate to work remotely to meet client needs and attend mandatory meetings. At Pride Center, As a result of coronavirus, survivor advocates have had to work remotely utilizing personal cell phones and their personal internet services. Previously, these services and utilizations were not required. In order to help compensate for this increased utilization and need for personal cell service and wifi for providing survivor services, we are offering a \$50/mont flat contribution towards aphone bills. In total, this is for 3 advocates over 9 months (April - December, 2020). \$50 flat monthly contribution x 9 months = \$450. \$450 x 3 advocates = \$1,350. Also at Pride/Safespace, as a result of coronavirus, advocates have not had daily access to client records (stored in paper on-site). Often these records are needed in order to provide comprehensive and well coordinated services that reflect past client disclosures and services. Through the purchasing of a laptop and database software, there will be remote access to client's data allowing us to run reports remotely and to provide more comprehensive and informed support to survivors throughout the coronavirus pandemic. Safeline will use FVPSA Covid Funds for products to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Umbrella will use FVPSA Covid relief fund for: Telephone and beepers at \$166/month; Supplies @ \$41/month to cover cleaning supplies, masks, thermometers, and regular office supplies needed for remote work; and Information Technology of \$83/month will beused to support video conferencing, and other virtual tools needed to provide remote advocacy. Voices Against Violence (VAV) will use their FVPSA Covid Funds to upgrade their technology to enhance acessibility for survivors such as adding a chat line, texting capabilities and support of a new phone system that will alow advocates to answer the hotline off site and enhance access to their client database offsite.

CONTRACTS NARRATIVE: Coronavirus has drastically impacted Pride/Safespace's work and operations supporting survivors. Contracting training and technical assistance in relation to strategic planning will help Pride/Safespace better meet the unique and new needs of survivors during COVID-19 Pandemic. The training and technical assistance listed above will include multiple days (in accordance with federal guidelines) of technical assistance and training to better meet the needs of survivors during coronavirus, and will only partially be funded through FVPSA at 29.9474%. Coronavirus related operational changes has resulted in Pride/Safespace no longer being able to manually hand off the warm-line for consistent warm-line coverage. They are now manually fowarding the line for shift changes between advocates, and are having increased call volumes since they are not currently offering inperson drop-in services. This is resulting in a new coronavirus driven need for a hotline forwarding or answering service which would cost approximately \$80/month over 12 months (\$960). This service would help us be able to provide better coordinated and more consistent support to survivors during the pandemic.

OTHER COSTS NARRATIVE: WISE's budget reflects its commitment to ensuring survivors and the community at large know that 24-hour victim advocacy support is still available. As our world shifted online due to the COVID-19 health crisis, WISE created the "We're Here" awareness campaign to share with our community that WISE support is still available - as it always is — with adaptations. This communication became critical as they closed their White River Junction and Windsor, Vermont support centers along with the Lebanon, NH Program Center and staff began working remotely. They also needed to communicate the newly added online chat and text capabilities they put in place for survivors and community partners to access their advocacy services. This mixed media campaign is using radio, newspaper, magazines, social media, community listservs, email and digital email communication to reach out across our Upper Valley community. Key elements of the campaign included:

- -Email communication to supporters and community partners (faith-based and civic organizations and businesses)
- -Community listservs
- -Radio:60 and:30 paid ads airing on WGXL, The River, WHDQ, Kixx Country
- -Social Media posts on Instagram and Facebook
- -Print ads in Valley News, Vermont Standard, The Dartmouth, Here in Hanover, Woodstock Magazine, Image Magazine, 4 Legs & a Tail (scheduled to hit in the coming weeks and months)
- -Monthly digital email communication
