JFO #2578 – Request to establish one limited service position in the Department of Children and Families. This position will lead the rollout of a new commodity food ordering system that will allow recipients to better manage school food programs, menus, and budgets.

JFO #2579 – In-kind donation of \$25,000 worth of services from State Smart Transportation Initiative (SSTI) to the Vermont Agency of Transportation. SSTI will support the preparation of a comprehensive transportation funding study required under Section 40 of Act 153. The amount of this donation is an estimate of the value of SSTI's work. No funding will be provided directly to, or flow through, the State of Vermont.

JFO #2580 – \$77,800 worth of land donated by Sarah Scharfenaker and Tom Koehne to the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife. This amount represents the value of 37 acres of land to be added to the Calendar Brook Wildlife Management Area.

JFO #2581 – Request to establish twenty-three (23) limited service positions in the Department of Vermont Health Access. These positions will work to design and implement the Health Services Enterprise System, with the intention of modernizing and replacing existing systems with an interoperable, digital, real-time health IT network.

Governor's Approval Needed for the Acceptance of a Donation in Sutton, VT.

Enclosed is an approval to be signed by Governor Shumlin for the acceptance of a donation from Sarah Scharfenaker and Tom Koehne of a 37-acre parcel to be added to Calendar Brook Wildlife Management Area (WMA). The addition of this 37-acre parcel located in the Town of Sutton to the Calendar Brook WMA will provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, fishing and wildlife viewing, and the conservation of significant wildlife habitat. The total budget for the project is \$2,000 which reflects the closing costs. The property itself is being donated to the VFWD by the landowners. Funding for the closing costs will come from Pittman-Robertson funds (federal funds).

Included with the Governor's approval memo are a map of the property, a copy of the review and approval by the Agency Land Acquisition Review Committee and Secretary, and a copy of the letter signed by the Sutton Select Board stating town support for the state acquisition of this parcel.

<u>Recommendation</u> That you approve the acceptance of the donation of a 37-acre addition to Calendar Brook Wildlife Management Area which will protect significant wildlife habitat and public access for all wildlife-based activities.

Description of Project

The addition of this 37-acre parcel located in the Town of Sutton to the Calendar Brook Wildlife Management Area (WMA) will provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, fishing and wildlife viewing, and the conservation of significant wildlife habitat (See Exhibit 1 for a map of the parcel). Calendar Brook Wildlife Management Area (WMA) is a 413-acre parcel of land located just west of the village of Sutton near the Sheffield-Sutton town line. The WMA takes its name from Calendar Brook, a tributary of the Passumpsic River which flows through the heart of the property. The WMA is mostly softwood forest, dominated by white and red spruce and balsam fir in the drier uplands, and white cedar in the wetland habitats. The spruce-fir softwood forests provide shelter from deep snow, cold temperature and wind-chill for deer. There are also small amounts of aspen, red maple and yellow birch mixed throughout.

Sarah Scharfenaker and Tom Koehne are siblings and recently inherited the property from their father, Richard Koehne. The 37 acres is not contiguous with the WMA. It is separated by one landowner in between (See Map). The parcel has a ROW from King George Road. Tom and Sarah tried to market the property and were unsuccessful. They now want to donate it to the Department. While it is not contiguous, it is comprised entirely of mapped deer wintering habitat and poor management could affect the habitat on our existing WMA as well as on the property itself. It is with this in mind, as well as additional public access values, that we wish to accept the donation.

Need and Cost

The VFWD is acquiring this parcel to provide permanent protection of public access for hunting, trapping, fishing, wildlife viewing, other wildlife dependent activities and

conservation of significant wildlife habitat including the deer wintering habitat. The estimate set for the total project costs are roughly \$2,000 which reflects the closing costs. The property itself is being donated to the VFWD by the landowners, Sarah Scharfenaker and Tom Koehne. Funding for the closing costs will come from Pittman-Robertson funds (federal funds).

Your approval of this acquisition is required by 10 V.S.A. §4144, which states in part "the secretary, with approval of the governor, may exchange, sell or lease lands under the secretary's jurisdiction when, in his or her judgment, it is advantageous to the state to do so ..." This project has already been reviewed and approved by the Agency's Land Acquisition Review Committee at their meeting in March, 2012 (See Exhibit 2). In addition, the town of Sutton supports this acquisition as documented in the letter from the Select Board dated 1/26/12 (Exhibit 3).

APPROVAL FOR PURCHASE OF LAND

We the undersigned, hereby approve the purchase of land by the Agency of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife to protect public access and the natural resources on the 37 acres belonging to Sarah Scharfenaker and Tom Koehne in Sutton, VT. This approval is required by 10 V.S.A. §4144 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated.


