In response to your questions:

- 1. There has been no authorization for work to proceed on this activity as the grant acceptance is pending. Once the grant is approved, we will need to approve a Change Control Request(CCR) form and modify the contract for the additional amount. At that point the vendor will begin work.
- 2. I can't say for sure when the timeline will start but I can estimate it. If the grant is approved 12/28, we can then approve the CCR and start the contract modification process. This generally takes around 6 weeks which would put the start of work at mid February. Development would begin immediately with system and UAT testing planned for the April/May timeframe. NMVTIS will be piloted at the same time VTDrives is (September/October 08) and implemented with the rest of the modernization system, planned for late November 2008.

Enclosed please find four (4) requests that the Joint Fiscal Office recently received from the Administration:

JFO #2303 – \$40,000 grant from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to the Department of Forests, Parks & Recreation. These grant funds will be used to support a temporary wetland restoration specialist position over the next two years. The wetland restoration specialist will be housed in Essex office of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and will work with the state and federal offices to restore wetland habitat in the Lake Champlain watershed.

JFO #2304 - \$33,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used by the Agency to enhance chronic wasting disease surveillance and cooperatively aid in the identification of captive cervids.

JFO #2305 - \$101,397.90 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used by the Agency to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops produced in Vermont by assisting eligible industry sectors increase sales directly to consumers, to domestic wholesale accounts, and through export channels.

JFO #2306 - \$447,115 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Agency of Transportation, Department of Motor Vehicles. 





Justification:

Development and implementation of the NMVTIS interface will allow VT to instantly and reliably verify the information on the paper title with the electronic data from the state that issued the title. Full, online participation in NMVTIS satisfies the system requirements for each state under the Anti-Car Act.
